Hello Boaters and Waterfront Lovers,

WEATHER:

We are winding down our fall Indian Summer with great offshore weather. Usually by the end of February this great weather will begin to change to our early spring conditions usually bringing strong northwest winds most days. Keep a close eye on the wind velocity readings at Point Conception Buoy days prior to going offshore. The winds will usually be calm on shore until 10 am and will tend to fool a person with sunshine and warm weather at the dock when after clearing the breakwater one encounters a very rough 4-5 foot wind swell on top of large offshore swell. The further you go out the worse it will get especially when you get to the wind line and anything that is not put away or attached goes flying. Oh yes, don't forget the hinge on the refrigerator door.

Be a smart boater and be really careful March thru June and enjoy your boat at the dock making repairs and enjoying your boating neighbors. So many times a new wants to be a boating family is turned off by trying to use their new boat during these rough water months. Great time for a winter vacation in Hawaii.

FISHING:

Fishing has been fair, with rockfish being the main target up to the January 1, 2009, closure.

Usually I like to fish Calico Bass, Sand Bass and drift Halibut. There are a number of very local rock piles and known halibut producing flat sandy spots.

Last week Jim Pennsinger and I took his boat the "FREEDOM" out to test one of the local rocks and managed to catch 8 or 10 Calicos and Sandbass. We wanted to try Halibut fishing but time ran out. These local spots are listed in a book named Fishing Spot Locator which can be obtained at West Marine or most fine tackle shops.

When trying to fish theses small spots it is very important to know where the rock pile is in relation to where you set your anchor. I will simply use the fathometer and GPS to locate the rock pile and set a bouy out on top of the rock. I will give the buoy enough time to settle in the current and wind allowing me to see how my boat will lay once I set anchor. I try to get the boats transom about 40 to 50 feet up current of the buoy so when we cast our baits they will sink at the edge of the sand and rock.

Next, string up a 6 to 8 foot light rod with 15 pound test. Tie a 1 ounce led head to end of the line. I like to use a 1/2" by 3" strip of squid laced on the hook.

Simply cast a the buoy you set as a marker allowing the bait to sink to the bottom. Next reel slowly until all the slack is out of the line. Lift the tip of the rod very slowly moving the bait an inch at a time and letting it set for 10 second between each move. What your going to feel is a fish tapping or mouthing the bait. When this occurs quickly set the hook and reel out slack keeping the tip of your rod high to prevent the fish from swimming into the rocks cutting your line. DFG rules apply and you will catch rockfish doing this which are close to taking during closure now in effect. Good Luck

BOATS:

I was recently asked by Mary Foster if I could focus on practical on board safety.

I think I can by starting with the ultimate danger, "sinking offshore". I have been aboard when sinking became our main concern. It's amassing how many things run through your mind when your boat starts to roll slower and further to each side only to find out she's half full of water. You suddenly find yourself doing a mental inspection of your pumps, switches and sea strainers and bilge bump strainers. Then you move up to intake hoses and valves and thru hulls. Next your in the engine room in 2 foot of water looking for any clue. I have only had this happen to my boat once and that was enough.

There is a real problem coming into the safety boats in general which will produce tragic events in the coming years which is the dribbles shaft seals.

Starting with the seals they cannot be fixed underway. These seals give the average boater a false comfort zone which is derived from not seeing water in the bilge is a good

thing my bilge pump and engine water system looks good.

What a boater needs to keep in mind is having dripless seals while great for cosmetics will

naturally keep you from testing pumps, hoses screens et in case of a bilge flooding. Yes, you can turn the bilge pumps and hear them run dry but will they pump water. My recommendation is to flood the bilge with fresh water and test you pumping stets at the dock regularly. If your boat sinks you may loose someone's life.
