

WSB Update:

On October 22nd under the light of a beautiful half-moon with an outbound high tide ebbing, we released 9,000-plus lively young White Sea Bass. Don Dickey did a tremendous job heading up this year's White Sea Bass project: He had the idea of protecting the fish from predators through the use of orange plastic construction fencing wrapped in multiple layers around the pens. He and his two sons spent many hours in the water doing the hard work of installing the protective barrier.

Both Don and his son Matt dove into the murky water at the release to bring up some dead fish and a dead cormorant from the bottom of the nets. The stench was horrible! Sea Hares, scallops, crabs and smelt were among the fellow residents of the pens. The nets also support tremendous amounts of seaweed and algae and will need thorough cleaning.

Fortunately, there was no barking of sea lions in the harbor, so we hope our beautiful little White Sea Bass were able to run the gauntlet successfully and make their way into the great ocean.

Thanks go to all the members of the White Sea Bass project who faithfully fed the fish and cleaned the nets every week since the start of the project in spring.

The White Sea Bass enhancement program for 2012 has ended. We started with a total of 14,000 fish in the spring. With the efforts of our crew, we managed to release, six months later, a little more than 9000, 6 to 9 inch White Sea Bass.

My many thanks to all of my fish feeding and volunteers who have spent at least one day a week for the last six months feeding and caring for the fish population.

Over the winter ahead we will be repairing and replacing the roof on the fish pens as well as our angler fundraising dinner which is coming up to raise money to replace our predator and interior nets.


We are looking forward to spring of 2013 where we will be raising another brood of White Sea Bass with the Hubbs Sea World White Sea Bass in enhancement program.


