




## WSB grow-out pen update:

## Follow-up on the Mediterranean Diet

Eating a Mediterranean-style diet can cut heart attacks, strokes, and death rates in people at high risk for heart disease by as much as a **THIRD**. The randomized study involved 7,500 people. Those on the Med diet got fish, five servings of fruit and veggies three times a week, and also additional olive oil and nuts each day. They were encouraged to eat white meat, rather than red, and legumes (peas, beans, lentils, soybeans, etc) at least three times weekly. Also, for those who drank alcohol, a glass or two of red wine a day was suggested. They were asked to AVOID sweets, such as cookies, pastries, cakes, etc, and to limit their consumption of dairy foods, including butter, as well as processed and red meats. Beefeaters, take note! (from the New England Journal of Medicine), summary in (Currents, Doc Lines, 2013).

We now know that excessive meat and dairy products in our diet lead to atherosclerotic disease. Researchers, however, were puzzled: Could a relatively small amount of ingested cholesterol be solely responsible for plaque formation?

In comes CARNITINE. This is a nontoxic compound, abundant in meats and dairy products, and necessary for cell metabolism of fatty acids. That's all fine and dandy, but there are bacteria in the intestines of most meat-eaters. These bugs just love carnitine. We'll call them the "Beefeaters." Ingesting carnitine, these microbes are able to throw an intestinal party, multiply, and become numerous.

Problem: As these bacteria digest carnitine, they release a waste product, trimethylamine, which the liver picks up and transforms into trimethylamine N-oxide (TMAO). This is a really, really bad chemical. TMAO gets into the bloodstream and causes hardening of the blood vessels and arterial plaques!!!

The logical conclusion is that if we get rid of these bugs, we get rid of TMAO. AHA! Antibiotics, you say. Not so fast. Antibiotics will kill off several pounds of our beneficial intestinal bugs as well. New strains will become immune. The cost would be enormous and compliance poor.

The curious finding is that peeps on the Mediterranean diet, do not have "Beefeater" bugs. Their intake of carnitine is low, but sufficient to allow normal cell metabolism. Also, heart-healthy pro-biotics or yogurt may be helpful in modifying intestinal flora.

Beware of energy drinks: Many contain as much carnitine as is found in a steak.

Therefore, eat more chicken, turkey, fish, veggies, fruits, and nuts (don't forget unsalted raw almonds. They are the best of nuts).

John and Lisa's diverse interests and talents make them a great addition to our club. Maybe one day we'll get to sample some of that great Italian cuisine!






