Anglers' Corner - March 2015

Fishing Report:

So far, the big fish for February is the fish that Joyce Johnson caught, off Santa Cruz Island on 2/7/15, it was a 15lb. Halibut. Gary managed to gaff his foot in the process. He had left the gaff in the halibut to make sure it wouldn't travel far, flipping around the deck. His bat was inside the cabin and he was baiting a hook with a live squid when the Halibut started flopping next to him. He went to subdue the fish by stepping on its head when the fish jerked and the gaff went through the bottom of his shoe and out through the side of his foot. The moral of the story is to be prepared, have the equipment you need at hand, and realize that we are dealing with wild animals and sharp instruments.

WSB grow out pen update:

We have completed a retagging and recount of the fish in the pens. We have 7634 fish left out of the original 8014 that were delivered, only a 4.7% loss! We had a small die off of some fish with a condition called bubble eye. I



understand that this is not a contagious disease, but a condition called Gas Super Saturation and shows up in some of the populations. Thanks to those who helped with the count.

Island Style Halibut Recipe:

1 box light brown sugar, Kikkoman soy sauce, fresh ground ginger, fresh smashed garlic, 1/3 jar orange honey.

Mix the glaze, working the sugar and honey into the soy liquid. Add ginger and garlic, lots and lots. Let fish soak in solution for four hours for B.B.Q. or 24 hours for smoking!

B.B.Q. with hot fire, to sear in juices and flavor. Add freshly ground macadamia nuts to sprinkle on top. Serve with fresh garlic bread, steamed asparagus, and twice-baked cheese potatoes. Now I'm hungry, time to go catch a flattie.

What You Should Know About Measles

On February 3, 2015, the on going measles outbreak may have started at Disney Park, but the Center for Disease Control (CDC) says it's not just for children.

Since the outbreak of measles early this year, one hundred and two cases were reported in 14 different states. It's the second largest number of this decade. The outbreak at the Disney theme park is responsible for 92% of these cases. According to the CDC 62% of these cases in California are Adults.

Measles is a highly contagious decease that is transmitted through the air by coughing and sneezing. The first signs appear to resemble flu-like symptoms: fever, cough, runny nose, and red watery eyes. As the red rash appears it travels down from the neck and then onto the back and stomach.

Vaccinations have been proven to almost eliminate the virus compared to the rate before the vaccination was introduced in 1963. Parents who do not wish their children to receive the MMR vaccination for religious or the now prevalent fear of autism, the CDC and the American Academy of Pediatrics state that there is no link to the MMR vaccination and autism comparing it to the flu vaccine. There is no live virus in receiving the vaccination.





Autophagy

No, it has nothing to do with motor vehicles. Translated from the Greek, it means, "consuming oneself." Consuming what, exactly? Dysfunctional, old cellular garbage. Some diseases, associated with old age, are thought to result from the **lack of autophagy**. This results in a decades-long buildup of toxic cellular debris. And this cellular garbage is the responsible culprit for at least some of these diseases.

Well, what can possibly turn autophagy on? It appears that a single gene can. A gene called AMPK turns autophagy on, and it helps the body get rid of cellular debris.

The bad news is that, although humans have the AMPK gene, the darn thing seems to be turned off. With little or no autophagy, there is more and more cellular garbage accumulating as we age. Not good.

Can anything be done to turn the AMPK gene on? Yep, UCLA has done it again. Not in humans, but in fruit flies. So, it can be done. Because fruit flies have been genetically mapped, it was easy to turn on just that one gene. Some 100,000 fruit flies were used in the experiment. And the results? The darn flies increased their life spans by a whopping 30%. Translated to humans, whose average life expectancy in the US is 78, we could expect to live to 101 years of age.

Will that happen? Well, it could. But as always we'll have to wait some 20-30 years for research to be completed. And will this bankrupt Social Security. And will Medicare pay for it?

But the latest research is also of great interest. It started a few years back with a "5/2 diet." One eats normally for 5 days, but interspersed are 2 days of either fasting, or reducing caloric intake to 25% of normal. The medical community was very skeptical.

But those who tried it did lose weight, and lots of it. Then the researchers found that when the body senses a lack of food (as the stomach growls), it clamps down, expecting famine. It goes into a defensive mode. It starts to repair damaged tissues, preparing for the worst. And it does that by inducing autophagy, and getting rid of damaged cells. Why this happens, we are not quite sure yet. Maybe hunger turns the above-mentioned gene on.

Think about it. As cavemen, we did not have the luxury of having breakfast. Rather, we would wake up hungry and spend the rest of the day searching for food, often not finding any. Our bodies evolved to cope with hunger. Interesting that some religions promote intermittent fasting. Maybe we should consider it, too.



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
