WSB grow out pen update:

All is going well at the pens. We hope to release the fish sometime in May. The Hatchery folks are looking into again giving us another 30,000 + fish because we were so successful last year.

Some fishing laws changed this year:

The California Fish and Game Commission adopted several changes to the current recreational groundfish regulations that apply to ocean fishing in state waters up to three miles from shore. The new regulations were adopted by the Commission at its Feb. 11 meeting, and became effective March 10.

The open season dates and allowable fishing depths for the recreational Groundfish Management Areas are as follows:

Depth to fish for rockfish has been increased from 50 fathoms to 60 fathoms,

An increase in the lingcod bag limit from two to three fish,

A sub-bag limit of five Black Rockfish within the 10-fish Rockfish, Cabezon, Greenling (RCG) complex bag limit,

Statewide closure of the California Scorpion fish fishery from Sept. 1 through Dec. 31.

"If you had the chickenpox the shingles virus is already inside you."

Shingles is a painful skin rash caused by the varicella zoster virus. Shingles usually appear in a small area on one side of the face or body. Shingles is most common in older adults and people who have weak immune systems because of stress, injury, certain medicines, or other reasons. Most people who get shingles will get better and will not get it again. But in some people there is a chance that shingles may return.

Shingles occurs when the chickenpox virus gets active again in your body. After you get better from chickenpox, the virus remains inside you. In some people the virus stays asleep. In others, the virus may return. A person with a shingles rash can spread the virus to another person who hasn't had chickenpox and or have not received the chickenpox vaccine.

Shingles symptoms include a headache or being sensitive to light. You may also feel like you have the flu. You may feel itching, tingling, or pain in a certain area. That's where a band, strip, or small area of rash may occur a few days later. The rash turns into blisters. The blisters fill with fluid and then crust over. It takes 2 to 4 weeks for the blisters to heal, and they may leave scars. Some people only get a mild rash. And some do not get a rash at all.

So if you think you may have shingles, see your doctor right away. Starting antiviral medicine right away can help your rash heal faster and be less painful. Good home care also can help you feel better faster. Take care of any skin sores, and keep them clean. Take your medicines as directed. If you are bothered by pain, tell your doctor. He or she may write a prescription for pain medicine or suggest an over-the-counter pain medicine.






