

WSB Update

September 5th we moved the WSB pens from the area in front of the recently reopened launch ramp to a slip away from the noise pollution and boat traffic. The predator net was cleaned and lifted, so it wouldn't get snagged on anything during the move. With the help of two Harbor Patrol boats the move was successfully completed, and we are now the first thing you see when walking down the gangway from the park to the docks on the same side as before. CIBFT:

Similar to last year, most teams in the 5 day Channel Islands Bill Fish Tourney headed to

Again this year, there seemed to be a lack of schooling bait fish to form the bait balls that attract and concentrate the bill fish into particular areas; however, there were a lot of squid in the

area. The Church Mouse Tournament caught and released 9 fish in their tourney but they had 90 boats in the two day event. On the fourth day of the tourney, things finally started to pop. **Team Ruckus** at 7:48 am, near the 277 fathom spot, caught the 1st Marlin on bait and released it. The same day, **Team TightRiv** got the 2nd Marlin on a jig and **Hydrocarbon** got the 3rd Marlin on bait.

There were 17 teams signed up for the tournament, 5 of the boats competing were from CIYC: **Dawn Patrol** డ్డు (Skip Miser), Mizpah (Bill Byron), Margaritaville (Don Johnson), JoySea (Gary Johnson), and Valkyrie (Frank Sullivan).

Team Valkyrie (Frank Sullivan, Don Dickey, Bob Ridenour and Don's son Matt Dickey) took the Big Fish vide pot with a 6.29lb. Yellow Tail caught under a kelp paddy almost to the 43 Fathom Spot. We found 2 kelp paddies while trolling and caught 9 YT, but they were all about the same size. We released 3 or 4 of them.

Team Joy Sea won the Farmers' Award when they lost a big fish. Their rod holder broke because a drag was set too tight, not only losing the fish but the rod, reel and lure. \$\$\$\$\$

A short history of the CIBFT: (Plagiarized from their website)

The Channel Islands Billfish Tournament was started in 1970 as a spin-off of the (Line of the Channel Islands Angling Club and for ten years was known as the Channel Islands) Invitational Broadbill Tournament. Only broadbill

swordfish were targeted in the seventies and the largest one ever taken was 443 lbs. caught in 1975 by Ted Naftzger. The last swordfish caught in the tourney was taken by Eve Radon in 1978 and it weighed 336 lbs.

In 1980 marlin were added to the tourney to spice things up, and it was then that this event became known as the Channel Islands Billfish Tournament. Since then, many marlin have been caught and many others released. The C.I.B.F.T. is unique because it is a relatively small tournament fished primarily by local anglers. The competition among boats is only exceeded by the camaraderie shared between crews.

The Bugs in Our Gut

A whole bunch of microbes live within our intestines. How many? A lot: 3.5 lbs of them there buggers. Who knew? And there are so many different varieties, too: about 100 different types of microbes. What the heck are they doing down there? Well, having a good party for sure, but also helping us with digestion, boosting our immune system, and producing good bio-active compounds which are absorbed into our system. Obviously this is a symbiotic (good for both parties) relationship.

Well, what happens if there are not enough bugs or not enough bug diversity in different individuals? Scientists in Belgium found that those individuals with lower "richness of species" in the intestinal flora were more susceptible to developing obesity-related conditions and chronic inflammation. Overweight peeps with poor bacterial flora were at higher risk of developing cardiovascular conditions than overweight peeps with very rich and diverse flora.

Apparently, about a quarter of people ("one in four" for the people in Rio Linda) have a significant lack of intestinal bacteria. What to do? Well, eating plenty of vegetables and some fruit leads to more richness and diversity of the flora. Increasing one's consumption of high-fiber foods gives microbes a longer time to party and propagate. Also, eating some pro-biotic, plain yogurt (not sugary ones with fruit on the bottom), and consuming less sugar are useful. After taking a course of antibiotics, it's important to repopulate our intestinal flora.

Become a Blood Donor and Help Prevent Heart Attacks and Strokes?

All is not well in "statin land." Statins are a group of drugs that reduce circulating cholesterol (especially LDL – the "bad" cholesterol). Is reining in cholesterol and preventing heart attacks in a population with **no known cardiac disease** worth it? Several papers point to marginal (if any) benefits in this group and highlight unwanted effects such as increased risk of developing diabetes, liver damage, muscle damage which leads to kidney damage. Also, cataracts and even erectile dysfunction (horrors).

Furthermore, some scientists suspect that atherosclerotic plaques may not be due to that old nemesis, cholesterol (although cholesterol is the main constituent of plaque in the arterial wall), but rather to an excess of stored iron in muscles and other organs, in the form of a compound called **ferritin**. The circulating ferritin in the bloodstream reflects the total amount of stored iron in the body. The normal range (according to newer publications) is 20-50 nanograms per milliliter of blood. Besides reducing cholesterol synthesis in the liver, statins also accidentally reduce ferritin levels. Therefore, some researchers theorize that this ferritin reduction is the beneficial effect of statin drugs. Not lowering cholesterol.

If this is true, there is a much simpler way to lower ferritin levels, and that is by "blood-letting" in the form of blood donation. It can't hurt and may benefit the donor as well as the recipient. Some 20

million peeps in this country are on statins. It is a huge industry. As always, consult your doctor. This article does not address patients with known cardiovascular problems.

The Birds and the Bees

Neo-nicotinoids are a newer form of insecticides that have been allowed on the market since about 2005. Shortly thereafter, an alarming collapse of bee colonies began. There are about 100 crops globally that provide 90 percent of our food. Of these, 70 percent depend on bees for pollination. Without pollinators, worldwide hunger could ensue. Here's a catch 22: Is it better to kill plant-eating insects or bees?

In addition to spraying foliage with neo-nicotinoids, many seeds are pre-coated with these insecticides prior to seeding. This is especially true for genetically engineered corn (GMO corn) grown in the US. The dust raised during the seeding process spreads the poisons far and wide. A single kernel of corn, a single grain of wheat, a seed of canola, can kill a bird. During the reproductive season, as little as $1/10^{th}$ of a coated seed per day can disrupt nesting.

Besides harmful effects on the birds and the bees, neo-nicotinoid seed treatments also appear to be responsible for the death of terrestrial and aquatic invertebrates. In these areas there are noticeably fewer life-forms in the topsoil, such as bacteria and earthworms. Sterile topsoil is less productive.

It was found that 50 percent of "bee-friendly flowers," sold by major outlets, are contaminated with neo-nicotinoids. The sales clerks may not be aware of this, but you should still inquire when buying flowering plants.

What is being done about all of this? Many European countries are banning neo-nicotinoid use altogether in their territories. Putin stated in an interview that the next global war would be about bees (unless Syria beats us to it). The US is not banning neo-nicotinoids, but recently the EPA developed new pesticide labels that prohibit the use of some neo-nicotinoids "where bees are present."
