

Doc Lines

Atherosclerotic Coronary Artery Disease

This is when cholesterol-laden plaques develop in the walls of heart arteries. What causes atherosclerotic plaque? Is it elevated serum cholesterol, or its sub-type: "bad cholesterol?" Or is it a chronic inflammatory process, damaging an artery's smooth inner lining, which induces repair by the proliferation of fibrous-forming cells, resulting in a plaque? If the latter, incorporation of cholesterol and calcium into the plaque is a secondary effect. To my mind, this issue has not been satisfactorily resolved yet.

And this has significant implications. If it is cholesterol, then drugs called statins will lower it. And if it is inflammation, a series of anti-inflammatory supplements may help. And, of course, it could be both. I will leave statins for your doctor to decide. I will focus on anti-inflammatory supplements.

What are the things that promote plaques and inflammation?

- 1) Too many carbohydrates, omega-6 vegetable oil, and trans fats
- 2) Deficiencies in vitamins A, C, D, E, K2, B6, B12 and folic acid. Also Mg, Se, Cu
- 3) Lipid oxidation products, abdominal obesity
- 4) Bacterial infection (gums, stomach [Heliobacter pylori], etc)
- 5) Diabetes, hypertension, smoking, stress
- 6) Family history

What are the supplements that fight plaques and inflammation?

Curcumin	Vitamin K2	Vitamin C	Gingko biloba
Quercitin	Vitamin E	Magnesium	Omega-3-fatty acid
Resveratrol	Coenzyme Q10	Selenium	Dry garlic concentrate
Vitamin D	Alpha Lipoic Acid	Zinc	

How do they do that?

Anti-inflammatory effect
 Curcumin, Quercetin, Resveratrol, Vitamins C, D, E, Selenium, Zinc, Magnesium, Omega-3
 Extract calcium from plaques
 Vitamin D, K2 (menaquinone-7) (Always consult your MD regarding K2, if on anticoagulants)
 Decrease platelet adhesiveness, anticoagulant
 Omega-3-fatty acid, Gingko biloba, Vitamin E, Magnesium
 Antioxidants
 Alpha Lipoic Acid, Coenzyme Q10, Vitamins C, E
 Vasodilator
 Magnesium

STEM TO STERN, FOAM TO DUST INSPECTING YOUR LIFEJACKETS IS A MUST!

This safety alert reminds all vessel operators to routinely inspect their lifejackets to ensure they are suitable for service. Recently Coast Guard inspectors in Key West, Florida discovered two vessels that had over 60 lifejackets that were required to be removed and destroyed. It was discovered that the unicellular foam buoyant material within the nylon outer shell had degraded significantly over time, broke apart, crumbled and in some instances was reduced to dust. The lifejackets were properly stored, kept dry, and not under direct sunlight; however, the location was very hot at times.

These particular lifejackets were the Type 1, 160RT model distributed by "The Safeguard Corporation" of Covington, Kentucky. They were manufactured in China and approximately nine years old. The distributor is no longer in business. Over the years, the Coast Guard has distributed a number of other safety alerts related to lifejackets and personal floatation devices (PFDs). As a result of this recent discovery the Coast Guard **strongly recommends** that vessel owners and operators inspect their Type 1 unicellular plastic foam lifejackets for potential indications of failure or degradation, specifically:

- Compression: The lifejacket may be compressed from many years of stowage.
- Loss of resiliency: The lifejacket is excessively hard, stiff or its foam is brittle. Normally after compressing the lifejacket to about half its initial thickness, the foam should expand to its original dimension in a short period of time.
- Shrinkage: A physical reduction in size may be indicated by "wrinkling" of the coating on vinyl dipped type or by a loose fitting shell on a fabric-covered lifejacket.
- Manufacturer: While the potential for problems applies to all older PFDs, those manufactured by "The Safeguard Corporation" should be closely examined.


