

# Anglers' Corner By Frank Sullivan

Well the New Year is in progress and the Anglers' dues are coming in. I appreciate the positive responses to the dues letter sent out this year. I'm still hoping for some input from the members on changes or improvements. Please drop me a note with your ideas. I know we will have a another stellar year.

The beginning of the year brings with it the closing of Rockfish season until March. Many of us will miss the opportunity of loading up on those tasty fish especially when the surface fishing is slow. It seems that you can almost always count on your favorite reef to save a slow fishing day.

That being said, there is still plenty of good fishing to be had at the islands or near shore. Now is the time to pickup some of the halibut and even a few Calico Bass in the deeper water in the flats.

So don't give up on fishing for the winter. Make sure you get your new License and give it a try. Heck, you might even win the monthly \$50 big fish prize! BTW, you need to get your dues in if you want to claim a monthly prize.

BTW, here is a Halibut troll technique I have used in the past:

Troll Troll 95% of the time for Halibut. This way you cover 100 times more ground in a day and end up with a purposeful effort fishing Halibut. Troll 6 rods with trap rigs, a three-way swivel set up and 16 oz torpedo sinkers. Put sea anchors off the bow, so they run short underneath the boat to slow it to about 1 MPH.

Use a 7' rod rated at 15-30., with anywhere from 15 to 30Lb line. Fish the reel in gear with the drag set as light as you can, no clicker. It is very surprising how light a rod you can use trolling 16 oz. It just takes getting used to. If you need more drag when fighting a fish, just press the line against the rod with your thumb. A tight drag is death always! As to letting line out, when trolling, if the rod is pinned, bent or loaded up, the fish is already on. If you see a bite and miss the fish, immediately drop back. Sometimes the Halibut will re-take the bait after striking it, if it is re-presented to him.

When reeling them up, DO NOT stroke the fish! You have a 16 oz sinker bouncing up and down if you do that! A steady wind and very small short pumps with a loooooooooooo drag. If you baby the fish to the surface, it is more likely that the fish will not come up hot and create a dysfunction while netting or gaffing.

This is a proven and consistently successful method to Halibut fishing. Drift fishing is hoping. Hoping that you will drift over the right area or over a fish by the grace of the wind. We call the Drifter men Wisher men. I'm Not saying that drifting does not have merit, but for targeting and CATCHING Halibut every trip, if you Troll, you'll Know.
