


Thank you, Carter Gage, for hosting our great dingy party.

Anglers' Corner - December 2016 By Frank Sullivan



So ends another fabulous fishing season! The CIYC Annual Anglers' Awards Scampi Dinner was well attended with 80 members and friends participating. Sharon Sullivan, Mary Ann Moore, Erika Barbaric, Marylou Taylor, Annie Landry, Sharen Matthews and Pam Nast had the big task of setting up the room. The food prepared by Gary and Joyce Johnson, Harry Krum, Rosemary Lippert, Elyse Gonnello, Skip **Preston, Jim Lee and Bob Nast** was outstanding. Everyone I talked to raved about it. The dinner and raffle is a fundraiser for the Anglers' Club and the funds are used for the WSB grow-out pens and other projects around the Club. Thank you: Erika Barbaric, Mary Ann Moore and Marylou Taylor for selling the Raffle Tickets. And thanks to Cecily, Don Dickey, Gary Johnson, and Jack Borkowski for helping to get items for the Raffle. Sorry if I missed anyone!

Joyce Johnson got the Big Fish of the year Trophy plus a \$100 check for catching a 47 lb. Halibut. The Men's Fishing Tourney Trophy went to **Gary Johnson**, who caught a 10.4lb Yellow Tail. **Joyce Johnson** won the Ladies 'Tourney Trophy with a 7.6 lb. Barracuda. Then Bill Lynch was presented with the very well-earned "Sportsman of the Year" Award. He worked on the WSB Grow-out pens as well as rebuilding the feeders and designing a special tool to remove and replace the "L" bolts that secure the nets to the floats.

WSB Pens Update: Once again our Grow-out pens were recognized by SeaWorld Research Institute for being the highest producing Volunteer-run facility in the statewide system. In February, we released about 2,000 fish after losing almost half to predators. In August we released a little almost 18,000 after doing some aggressive repairs to the pens. In November we took delivery of 12000 fish to hold over the winter.

Anglers' Club Info: Angler's dues of \$10 for the 2016 fishing season are due January 1st 2017. Please send in your Angler's dues with your regular club dues billing. If you forgot and sent the CIYC dues in without the anglers' dues, you can provide a SEPARATE check made out to "Channel Islands Yacht Club, Anglers" and put Anglers' Dues in the memo section of the check and send it or bring it to the Club.


Reminder: Rockfish season ends December 31st 2016 and doesn't reopen until March 1st 2017! These species may only be taken or possessed in waters less than 360 ft. (60 FM)) deep. The daily bag and possession limit is 10 fish in combination of all species within the RCG Complex. There are exceptions so check here: https://www.wildlife.ca.gov/Fishing/Ocean/Regulations/Groundfish-Summary#south to get the most current regulations!

Yelloweye rockfish, canary rockfish, bronzespotted rockfish, and cow cod may not be retained (bag limit: zero).

When you are a CIYC Anglers' Club member you can win \$50.00 if you bring in the biggest Legal fish of the month. Marlin, sharks, rays and tournament fish do not count. You can only win once a year, but as the Lotto people are fond of saying "You can't win if you don't play ".

There is a scale in the shed where the ice machine is. All you must do is weigh the fish in with a CIYC club member or bartender as witness and record the weight, or Weigh in at the certified scale at PCYC or CISCO's Sportfishing. Put the record in the Anglers mail box in the hall down stairs. If you like, call me on my Cell 805-205-4073 and I will witness your catch and take a photo for the Currents. You may also e-mail me the photos and details.

You may also win the Big Fish of the year and \$100 if you turn in the largest fish before the Anglers awards dinner occurs in November. The Big fish of the year does not have to have been a big fish of the month winner and may be a tournament fish other than marlin, sharks or rays.









Doc Lines

On the Horns of a Dilemma

We all know the Zika virus may cause microcephaly and other neurological problems. Also, the virus can be found in sperm long after the acute phase, and it can transmit through intercourse.

Recently, it was discovered that the virus can cause testicular atrophy, where testicles become small to about 10% of the original. That raised alarms. We can live without brains, but can we live without balls?

That cannot stand. What would happen to bocce ball tournaments? What to do? Well, developing a vaccine is one way. Another is to eliminate the carrier, the mosquito.

There are different abatement programs, including spraying. The most recent one is genetically modifying male mosquitos so that after mating in the wild, their eggs don't hatch. Limited releases in test areas reduced mosquito populations by 96-99%. No more Zika, Chikungunya, Dengue, Yellow Fever, Malaria, St. Louis Encephalitis, West Nile Virus, La Crosse Encephalitis, Filariasis, and Canine Heartworm. No more toxic spraying. Wow!

This reminds me of when Red China in the early 1950s was suffering from bad crops: They blamed birds eating peasants' seeds. The government ordered the people to take their pots and pans and make noise at exactly the same time, all together, for a month. That prevented birds from landing, and the avian population plummeted. Not only the seed thieves, but all birds. The ensuing years saw devastating famines as insect populations exploded, destroying crops.

That question now faces the WHO and FDA, and many governments whose entomologists are working on genetic mosquito programs. What are the unknown consequences of eliminating the world's mosquito population? Would bats starve, would birds die, would freshwater fish decline, would some other species explode or fill that niche? Will governments err tragically as Red China did, or is this the way to eliminate myriad diseases? In 2015 limited tests were done in L. A. and on Fire Island, NY, without untoward effects. Key West is against it. What to do?

Follow-Up on Viagra Replacement (Another Horny Issue)

Many of you expressed a desire to get your hands on the gel discussed in my recent Doc Lines. The names of interested parties will be published shortly. Unfortunately, for now, it can only be purchased in European pharmacies and on the Web in some European countries. So, those of you travelling to Europe may consider bringing some back to share!

Australian scientists are taking a different approach: They're developing an oral spray laced with a drug similar to Viagra. So far, experiments were conducted only on rodents. But it is very effective. One spritz into the mouth, and BOOM! It may be two years before it hits drugstores.



Fisherman's Wharf Proposed Massive Apartment Complex's Walls Out Boater Parking and Public Access

The above building plans show what you will see from Victoria Avenue or from the Harbor. The top architectural drawing is the east side of the building that faces Victoria Avenue. The first level is a wall 18 ½ feet high, the height of an average two-story building. It will be 2 city blocks long with barred vents to a private parking lot only for the apartment residents. Interestingly, this elevation was not shown to the public and was only obtained through the Public Information Act.

The drawing below it was used for promoting the project to the public. It depicts the west side which faces the Harbor and can be seen only from the inside the harbor and Paz Mar. It conveys an airy, open impression with many large "view corridors". View corridors are required for coastal projects but the "blue sky drawing" gives the impression you can see through the project. The east side shows the project is four stories high and does not have such "view corridors". This proposed complex is also not consistent with the Coastal Act that places residential development as a low priority for coastal land. Is this the right project to develop on public land in our harbor?

Headline:

County and Developer Threaten City of Oxnard with Lawsuit Demanding an Expeditious Processing of an Amendment to the City's Local Coastal Plan

On August 24, 2016, the California Coastal Commission notified the Harbor Director that their proposed Public Works Plan Amendment application was incomplete and would require among 8 items:

- an amendment to the City of Oxnard's Local Coastal Plan
- a more comprehensive traffic study reflecting peak visitor times in the summer, and addressing the impact of the project on traffic volumes and public access.

On September 1, 2016, the Harbor Director officially submitted a letter requesting that the City amend its Local Coastal Plan (LCP) to conform to its General Plan adopted in 2011. The Harbor Director has claimed that under state law, the City is obligated to conform its LCP to its General Plan. The Harbor Director is wrong. Within the Coastal Zone, the City's LCP takes precedence over the General Plan. In fact, according to the Coastal Act, the General Plan must conform to the certified and approved LCP.

Since the City is currently in the process of updating its LCP, it has requested specific information from the Harbor Department in order to determine the appropriate action it should take. This has resulted in letters threatening legal action from the Developer, Channel Islands Properties LLC, and from the County. Why all this pressure for a rushed decision from the City? The Harbor Department earlier even drafted an amendment for the City to adopt. Why such presumptive action and haste? The City of Oxnard has the jurisdiction and obligation to determine if it should amend its LCP or exercise any of its available options prior to an LCP amendment. Whatever the City elects to do, it should involve an open and complete public review process.

Help Stop this Massive Walled Apartment Project from Going Up in our Harbor with your Tax Deductible Donation.
