Anglers' Corner - December 2014

On November 22nd we had a great **Anglers' Awards Dinner** prepared by Dave Gable and his Crew. We recognized and thanked the members of the White Sea Bass Grow-out Pen Team for the hard work accomplished this year.

Sheri Ireland won both the Ladies' Tournament and the Big Fish of the Year with a 28.1 lbs. White Sea Bass caught on Skip Miser's *Dawn Patrol*. The cash prize was \$100, and her name was engraved on the Big Fish of the year Trophy and the Ladies' Tournament Trophy.

This year's Sportsman of the Year Trophy was awarded to Bob Deyling in recognition of catching the first Marlin in the Channel Islands Bill Fish Tournament (This was his 1st marlin and the 1st marlin caught on the *Valkyrie*), and all his work on the WSB pens and participation in the Anglers' programs.

WSB Pen Update: After a banner year for our Grow-out pens, we were recognized by Sea-World Research Institute for being the highest producing Volunteer-run facility on the statewide system. Additionally, the folks at SeaWorld Research Institute calculate that our fish grew at a rate 1.4 times that of the other pens in the system. We expect to receive another Cohort on juvenile WSB this month to hold over the winter months.

Anglers' Club Info: Angler's dues of \$10 for the 2015 fishing season are due January 1st 2015. Please send in your Angler's dues with your regular club dues billing. If you forgot and sent the dues in without the anglers' dues, you can provide a SEPARATE check made out to "Channel Islands Yacht Club, Anglers" and put Anglers Dues in the memo section of the check and send it or bring it to the Club.


Reminder: Rock fish season ends December 31st 2014 and doesn't reopen until March 1st 2015! These species may only be taken or possessed in waters less than 300 feet (50 fathoms) deep. The daily bag and possession limit is 10 fish in combination of all species within the RCG Complex (includes all species of Rockfish, Cabezon and Greenlings) per person, with a sub-limit on Boccaccio (3 per person, also included in the 10 fish RCG Complex aggregate limit). Yelloweye rockfish, canary rockfish, bronzespotted rockfish, and cowcod may not be retained (bag limit: zero).

When you are a CIYC Anglers' Club member you can win \$50.00 if you bring in the biggest Legal fish of the month, sharks, rays and tournament fish do not count. You can only win once a year, but as the Lotto people are fond of saying "you can't win if you don't play".

There is a scale in the shed where the ice machine is. All you have to do is weigh the fish in with a CIYC club member or bartender as witness and record the weight. Put the record in the Anglers mail box in the hall down stairs. If you like, call me on my Cell 805-205-4073 and I will witness your catch and take a photo for the Currents. You may also e-mail me the photos and details.

You may also win the Big Fish of the **year** if you turn in the largest fish before the Anglers awards dinner in November. The Big fish of the year does not have to have been a big fish of the month winner and may be a tournament fish.

To D or not to D?

This comes from UCSD. People in the study who **died from any cause** were found to have a low level of vitamin D in the blood. The authors suggest one's blood level for 25-hydroxyvitamin D should be checked annually. Levels of 20-30ng/ml are too low. Normal levels are 30-80 ng/ml.

Indeed, low vitamin D levels are common in **the elderly, the overweight**, in those **who lack direct exposure to sunlight**, or **live in northern latitudes** during winter months, or have **dark skin.** Also, many middle-eastern women have low vitamin D.

We know that vitamin D3 is used for preventing and treating rickets and lack of bone calcium in adults. It also **prevents cancer**, boosts the **immune system**, increases **antimicrobial** peptides in the blood, cuts the risk of **Alzheimer's** disease by 50%, quells **anemia** in chronic kidney disease, promotes cells to **utilize insulin**, among other things. Clinical trials are underway to see if vitamin D is of benefit to patients with **multiple sclerosis**. But, why wait?

Preventing cancer? Yep, especially **prostate** cancer, and possibly **breast and colon** cancer. Vitamin D regulates the growth rate of normal and cancer cells. It helps them to differentiate. Most cancer cells are undifferentiated. It also suppresses prostate inflammation, which could be a precursor to prostate cancer. Vitamin D in the blood of patients with aggressive prostate cancer was as low as 12 ng/ml.

We know that sunshine produces vitamin D in the skin. The problem is that as we age, this process is slowed down to a trickle. Even worse, the elderly would have to strip down to skimpy bikinis or Speedos (horrors) for hours. A nudist beach? Think of the sunburns! Foods such as oily fish, eggs, and mushrooms are natural sources of vitamin D, but they are not sufficient to keep blood levels high enough.

The UCSD group recommends taking up to 4,000 IU (international units) of vitamin **D3** daily. Many other scientists also support this dosage, but they caution to check with your doctor first, as there are some conditions where vitamin D is not indicated (lymphoma, sarcoidosis, primary hyperparathyroidism, etc).

If you're heliophobic, tied to your computer, overweight, or elderly; have a prostate, a colon, breasts or immune disorders: Please read this article twice! Carefully!

CIYC's Second Classical Guitar Recital




















'Get Your Cruise On' Unscheduled/impromptu cruise to Yellowbanks Oct 25th & 26th
