


### Hello All,

### **Operating Naked**

It all comes down to how bacteria shed from human skin and contaminate the operating room. Apparently, bacteria get into the air attached to tiny skin flakes called *squamules*. 

### Harbor Department and Ventura County Challenge Oxnard City's Jurisdictional Authority to Review Proposed Fisherman's Wharf 400 Apartment Complex at the Coastal Commission Hearing This Month

The Harbor Department (HD) and Ventura County (VC) have officially filed for a "Dispute Resolution" hearing this month before the Coastal Commission (CCC). The purpose of this Dispute Resolution hearing is not to determine the proposed development's compliance with the Coastal Act. At this hearing, the only issue will be the City of Oxnard's jurisdiction over its Local Coastal Plan (LCP) and its related procedures and process the Harbor Department aims to circumvent.

As previously reported, the Coastal Commission staff has determined, that Amendment 7 to the Harbor's Public Works Plan (PWP) for the Fisherman's Wharf Apartment Complex, is inconsistent with the City's LCP. This means the Harbor Department is required to get the City to amend their LCP in order for the proposed project (Amendment 7 to the PWP) to proceed to the next stage of CCC review and possible approval.

The City has requested the Harbor Department provide more detailed information about the proposed development, including a specific plan, in order to proceed through their LCP amendment process. To date, the Harbor Department has been unwilling to do so. Instead the Harbor Department and County has chosen to take the position that the City does not have the right to review the project. How then can the City be expected to reasonably and responsibly determine whether it should amend its LCP?

It is clear from emails between the Harbor Department and City Planning Staff, that initially the Harbor Department inappropriately presumed that the City would simply amend its LCP to facilitate fast tracking the project through the CCC process. However, that would have meant the City would need to forgo, basically abdicate, its jurisdiction over its own LCP. The City has rightfully chosen not to do so.

The Harbor Department and County is "disputing" the City's jurisdiction on this matter in order to avoid the City's LCP amendment process, whose outcome is uncertain and public and transparent.

Whatever the outcome of the Dispute Resolution hearing, the piecemeal planning of harbor development remains an issue. Development of public land that is contrary to the harbor's entrusted priority of visitor-serving and harbor-oriented facilities remains an issue. A gated 400 apartment complex is not a priority use of public coastal land. Residential development that removes a substantial number of low cost or no cost public and boater parking should be rejected.

Development that promotes recreational boating, fishing, and other water recreation that attracts visitors to the harbor area and the Channel Islands National Park should be supported. Facilities for commercial fishing, marine and boating related businesses in the harbor should be promoted and maintained.

As advocates of boating and recreational water activities and as active harbor community members, what can and should we do?

### Rene Aiu, Co-Harbor Delegate

Support the City of Oxnard's jurisdictional right and Oppose on-going piecemeal planning of Harbor development. Support to keep our Harbor the premier small boat and water recreation harbor as envisioned.


