## Message From The Rear Commodore Cary Verstynen




Hello fellow club members.

## **GUIDELINES FOR BUY AND PREPARING MEALS FOR CIYC**

## 1. Before purchasing food for your meal, please:

- (a) Check the stock in the CIYC kitchen first there may be items that you can use such as spices, flour, butter, cheese, butter, garlic, etc. This will cut down the cost of the meal. If garlic is purchased prechopped, time is saved.
- (b) Estimate the number of people you will have for dinner; multiply that number by the price of the dinner; multiply by 40% this figure is the upper amount that should be spent for the ingredients for dinner. For example, 50 dinners X \$10 = \$500 X 40% = \$200; however, if you can spend less, please do!
- (c) Good bargains on bulk food may be found at Smart & Final, Sam's Club, and Costco. Potato products may be purchased through Valley Spuds. Watching ads in the paper or ones received in the mail is also helpful.
- 2. When staffing for dinners, a good guideline is 4 people for Wednesdays and 5-6 on Saturday. If there are too many people, it's difficult to move around easily.
- 3. The ovens take some time to warm up, please turn them on when you arrive to prepare. Also, the proper sequence to turn them on is first, the bottom gas knob is turned to the left until the mark lines up with the "on" second, the top knob turns to the left until the mark lines up with "one," at which time the fan comes on third, set the temperature. These are convection ovens that will cook faster than a regular oven, so time or temperature will have to be adjusted accordingly.
- 4. DO NOT POUR GREASE DOWN THE DRAIN. Pour it in a can and, when it has cooled, throw the can in the trash. This will save on plumbers' costs!
- 5. When the meal is ready, fill the steam table upstairs with water to at least 1" deep measured at the basin furthest from the water supply after the water level has normalized. Then turn the temperature to the proper setting (Approx. #4 or 5). If you are serving banquet style, set up the folding tables.
- 6. At the end of the meal clear up your work areas and scrape out any cooking pans you've used then set them in the sink to soak. Package and mark any leftovers with the date and what it is before placing them in the refrigerator or freezer.

This should be a fun experience for you and your crew. Relax and remember - you're cooking for friends!!



## HISTORIAN **Beverly Hamilton**

Did you ever wonder where the names "HOLLYWOOD BEACH" and "SILVER STRAND" came from? Well--- in 1920 Paramount Studios signed on a handsome new actor from Italy named Rudolph Valentino to star in an upcoming film "THE SHEIK".

The location unit from Paramount Studios found an empty beach in the city of Oxnard about 80 miles from Hollywood. There were sand dunes, a small lake for an oasis, beautiful beaches and great weather. One drawback – no trees.

Paramount's set department went to work and delivered 200-300 palm trees with non-fading green fronds, gracefully swaying trunks and papier mache coconuts. They could be planted and then moved as needed.

The movie was filmed in 1921 and was an immediate success. Rudolph Valentino became an instant star and Oxnard became the new Hollywood. The area became "Hollywood by the Sea" Another development was named "Hollywood Beach" and a third was "Silver Strand".

Developers jumped in and were selling small lots suitable for resort living for \$200.00 each. Just imagine, ocean-front houses are now in the Million Dollar range.

This, however, marked the start of what is now the marina named Channel Islands Harbor and is one of the most successful boating and recreation areas along the California coast.





It took over 25 years from when Congress authorized the study of the harbor to it's dedication on Memorial day, May 30, 1965. Our own Jimmy Donlon was one of the major people involved in getting the harbor up and running.

Fun Fact! The palm trees were returned to Paramount Studios and were acquired by the Ambassador Hotel on Wilshire Blvd. in Hollywood for their new ballroom, which was quite bare and uninviting. By installing the new trees, the ballroom became the "Coconut Grove" and was soon the "hotspot" for the Hollywood crowd.
