

Water Fronts for Feb. 23

The year's biggest racing fleet turned out last weekend for the SCYA Midwinter Regatta, hosted by Channel Islands Yacht Club. Of the 26-boat fleet, the biggest class was the 13-boat J-24 Class, which was won by Chris Snow of San Diego Yacht Club in Bogus. Taking second was Pat Toole's 3 Big Dogs of Santa Barbara Yacht Club, while Deke Klatt of Ventura Yacht Club placed third in Jaded.

Dick Velthoen and Dave Boatner co-skippered the J-35, Rival, to a perfect 5-0 mark to win the five boat spinnaker class. Other winners were Robert Heatherly's Grace in the non-spinnaker class and Cody Schlub in Sasquatch in the Santana 20 class. Sclub also had a perfect 5-0 record for the weekend.

The J-24 class sailed six races, while the other classes sailed five. The first J-24 race, won by Tortoise, was tossed out by the race committee because of confusion about the course. The race marks were different colors than announced in the race instructions.

Anglers' Corner

WSB grow out pen update:

There is bad news and more bad news for the WSB pens.. We took delivery of 9500 fish by commercial boat August 30th 2011 and another 4500 by tank truck September 6th 2011. Since then we have had a series of losses through oil spills, a break in by a large sea lion and numerous raids by cormorants. Our major problem stems from the fact that the exterior "predator" net has a mesh size that is too big. The net lets the cormorants through to the interior containment nets and they then work on those nets until they can get through them as well. We also have one net position that is not in use and covered with bird netting that has been compromised. We have repaired the nets over and over. There is a line in the movie Jurassic Park that sums it up "nature will find a way"! That is particularly true with these hungry birds.

On Tuesday 2-21-12 Hubs Sea World Research Institute came up to the pens for a count and we found out that in pen #1 we had only 1322 out of the original 9500 and in pen #2 we only had 1169 fish out of the original 4500! We intend to release these fish about March 2nd on the evening outgoing tide.

I really appreciate all the help for the WSB team this last year especially Don Dickey and Ryan Gamble who dove the nets numerous times to repair and inspect them, wearing only light wetsuits in 54 degree waters. Also, thanks to the "Fish Daddies" who came every day to feed and check on the fish and Skip Miser who did lots of repairs many out of his own pocket.

On the positive side we expect another delivery sometime in April. Skip Miser is researching some alternate materials to secure the perimeter of the pens. HSWRI does not have the money to replace the predator nets, so we will have to find a solution for that issue as well. If you have an idea please let us know.
