

It will be picked up by a rendering company and **NOT** put in the general garbage. Recently, we discovered a number of large plastic storage bottles containing many, many gallons of used cooking oil. They were found behind the ice maker storage shed after power-washing the area behind the shed. This created a huge problem. It took several hours to clean the area of oil, water and general mud. Please do not store any grease or lard on the premises for any reason. If you are in doubt how to dispose of any grease, please contact the Commodore or Vice Commodore.

On a happy note, the **salt and pepper tray** has been thoroughly cleaned, washed, and repainted by <u>Erica Barbaric</u> and <u>Les Hardwick</u>. These two members came to us and asked if they could clean the salt and pepper tray in the upper galley and paint it. This was their idea and they followed through with a fine example of club membership participation. The Race Committee, comprised of PRO Bill Brayton, Vice Commodore Tom Warden, Terri Potts-Chattaway (CIWSA Commodore), Jay Chattaway, and Margy Gates (CIWSA) aboard Woody Underwood's boat, ABSOLUTE, assured clean and timely starts for the Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker competitors. Photos from the Race Committee boat were taken by Terri and Margy. Additional volunteers from CIWSA furnished a light breakfast and a hearty afternoon snack for the racers. A total of 13 boats entered -- 9 of which had CIYC ladies and/or CIWSA ladies at their respective helms. Very light air and fog dominated the approximate 10-mile courses for both fleets. In first place Overall and Spinnaker class was Sandy Sampson (RIVAL, VYC), whose corrected time was more than 20 minutes ahead of the rest of her class. Additional Spinnaker results went to Roxanne Vettese (CIYC, TROUBLEMAKER) for second place; third to Suzi Ramey (TORTOISE, VYC), and fourth to Lisa Rizzo (CIWSA, PALOMA). Dawn Brooks (MAJIC DRAGON, PBYC) did not finish (DNF). In non-spinnaker Trish Castanon (OUT PATIENT, AYC) squeezed in at first place by a mere 9 seconds corrected time over Jane Thomas' all-female crew on Bill Crocket's LIQUID ASSET (CIYC), which earned first in the All-Women Crew class. The remainder of the non-spinnaker boats' corrected times were 10 minutes to 1.5 hours later: third to Chris Williams (QUIET TIMES, Tom Warshauer, CIYC); fourth to Mary Foster (ZOARCES, Shelly Johnson, CIYC); and fifth to Erika Barbaric (TOMAHAWK, Zoran Barbaric, CIYC). The lack of wind and inopportune appearance of fog led to DNFs by Mary Howard and Sandra Lochridge (FUSEE, Harry Krum, CIYC); LeeAnne Clark (SPRAY, Charlie Clark, CIYC); and Cindy Arosteguys' all-female crew (ARGO, CIYC). WSB Update

Skip Miser's 44.8 lbs. halibut won the Big Fish of the month for August, but he asked the award be set aside for the WSB Pen program. Thanks Skip! So far no Big fish has been turned in for September.

CIBFT:

After three years of relatively cool water and few marlin to be caught, this year looked promising. Most teams in the 5-day **Channel Islands Bill Fish Tourney** headed to Catalina Island where we found water temps in the 70 to 75-degree range with excellent clear blue color. However, there seemed to be a lack of schooling bait fish to form the bait balls that attract and concentrate the bill fish into particular areas. That meant the fish were present but spread out over a wide area of the SoCal Bite. Of the dozen or so boats in the **CIBFT**, almost all had at least seen jumpers, some had knockdowns and a few had hookups.

On the first day **Team Ruckus** caught the 1st Marlin and released it off of the Slide. The next day **Team Stingeray** caught and weighed in a 177-lb Marlin off the Slide at tide change. **Dick Olsen** on **Team Dawn Patrol** caught a nice Mahi-Mahi, also off the Slide and won the biggest exotic for the side bet on the second day.

Although we had scratch fishing for the 5 days, all seemed to agree that the event was a success. The high points for **Team Valkyrie** were meeting up with fellow CIYC members in Avalon at the Avalon Grill for dinner on the second night, and having dinner with **Team Dawn Patrol** in Two Harbors on the last night. **Team Valkyrie** also received the coveted **"Farmer"** trophy for calling in a hookup that was actually kelp (doh!) and responding to a Mayday on the way home from a 14-ft Whaler with a dead engine drifting into the surf off of Hueneme.
