WSB pen Update:


When I wrote the April article for the Currents we were planning on deploying the WSB nets to begin receiving





As I Remember-----Random Thoughts

While spending an evening with Johnny Walker and Jack Daniels discussing the Stimulus program, random thoughts were floating around in my memory. These thoughts were consistent with events of CIYC.

* At one time CIYC had a classic Juke Box in our clubhouse, probably in the 1986-1988 time frame. This machine was available for dancing and/or entertainment as members desired. You could make 2 selections for 25c or 5 selections for 50c, I don't remember if you needed a 50c coin or two 25c coins for 5 selections. It was fun.

* The original name for our club was "Channel Island Yacht Club", several years later an S was added to make the name "Channel Islands Yacht Club". So if you see club items identified without Islands it probably is old or a maybe a typo.

* CIYC telephone number was changed to make it easier to remember the clubhouse number. New number 805 985-2492 which is 805-985-CIYC, just remember the club and its easy. This was just another helpful do-good deed for CIYC members.

*"Weigh Anchor", This nautical term for raising the anchor may have derived from the fact that every time the anchor was pulled up, it was accomplished by hand, at least on most sail boats. This was an excellent opportunity allowing the crew members hauling it up to gain working knowledge of its weight, which is generally considerable, especially if another boats anchor is coming up with it.

* CIYC has a trophy called the "Dolphin Trophy"; this trophy was donated to CIYC in honor of a man named Warren Butler and was donated by his wife. This trophy donation was to celebrate the fact that Mr. Butler had fallen over-board during a CIYC boating event. This trophy is to be awarded to any member who follows Mr. Butler lead by falling over-board during a CIYC boating event. This trophy is now in the form of a patch for the trophy winner to sew on club jacket for other members to admire.

*America's Cup Race- was sailed in Australia in 1987 and was won by USA's Stars and Stripes skippered by Dennis Connor. CIYC's Captain Sam Shirck of Contential Air Lines had the privilege of flying the winning trophy and crew back to the United States. Quite an honor for one of our members, we were all very proud. 

As I Remember---- CIYC Anglers

Fishing has always been a large part of club activity, I have seen reports of a club fish fry in the early 1960s on the site where the Lobster Trap is now located.

As CIYC grew in members, the fishermen, and fisherladies acted to organize an active fishing club. In early January 1982, A Fishing Activity Committee was formed in order to try to create the most interest and to develop a real progressive fishing program. John Banford was the chairman.

By the end of January 1982 the fishing club had 60 members who had paid \$10.00 each and were "ready to fish". Fishing contests were to be on a continuing basis instead of specific days, which to better, accommodate sailboats as well as power boaters. The club planned to provide cash or fishing equipment awards for the winners of the contests. Other club rules were generally as follows. [May be different by 2009]

1. Fish must be caught within 100 miles of Channel Islands Harbor

- 2. Sharks and Rays. Are not to be considered as winners
- 3. Fish must be larger than 4 pounds
- 4. Must be caught on rod and reel
- 5. Fish can be verified by any CIYC member
- 6. Fisherperson must be a paid CIYC Angler
- 7. Angler must bring the fish to the boat, can have help gaffing or netting

CIYC and PCYC scales can be used, others if verified.

This committee planed to put on a Fish Fry on the third Friday of each month, all club members were invited. The first Fish Fry was held on January 29, 1982. They served 91 dinners. The second Fish Fry was held on February 19,1982 where 126 dinners were served, March Fish Fry served 132 dinners, these folks had a good thing going, dinners were priced at \$3.50 each.

The Fishing Club changed its name to "The Anglers" and continued its progressive ideas with Ladies Day contests, Fishing Derby Interclub contests, fund raising events, flea markets in conjunction with the Channel Islanders. The Anglers purchased professional Fish Fryers and other equipment for the club and provided donations to various Marine improvement and preservation groups as well as the White Sea Bass program.

The Anglers have continued to be very active under the leadership of several knowledgeable and dedicated members consistent with the ideas and foresight including Fish Fry's, as considered by John Banford and his original group in 1982. Now is the time to join the Anglers and be "ready to fish".







