Fleet Surgeon Karen Berlin RNC

I hope this article finds everyone well and having a good season. I apologize for not placing a article last month, I think the month got away from me.

I have heard people ask about CPR and who knows it at the club. I am sure there are several of you that do know it or did at one time. I think in a emergency you could come up with enough to get you by. I want to answer some questions for you that might help you feel better about needing to actually follow through on CPR if needed.

Chest compressions are estimated to do about 20-30% of the efficiency of a normal heart. The ratio of 2-person CPR is still 30:2 and I know there is a lot of talk around just doing chest compressions without breaths but as of now that is not the standard. When you breathe into another persons lungs you are exhaling 16% oxygen which is less than the normal 21% but close. How do you know that your chest compressions are working? Well remember it is better to perform imperfectly than not at all.

People wonder if they can kill a person in cardiac arrest. Well they are already clinically dead, CPR can only help. Ribs are frequently broken with the pressure of CPR and some studies quote up to 30% of the time. This happens frequently in older victims since the cartilage is less compliant and the bones more easily crack able. Again remember it is better to have cracked ribs than to be dead. I would rather not tell you the % of people that make it with CPR because it is certainly not a desirable rate of survival, but if you have an AED device like we do it increases by to 30%. If you wonder if you can get aids from doing CPR the answer is NO there are not documented cases. The good Samaritan law protects you in a medical emergency just ask Tom Warden. You should stop CPR only when help arrives or the person starts moving, has a heart rate, or is breathing. If they are breathing they have a heart rate. If you are alone and do not know CPR call 911 and ask the emergency dispatcher to give you instructions over the phone. Now on to signs and symptoms of a possible heart attack.

- 1. Persistent chest pain or discomfort: victim may have persistent pressure squeezing, or crushing type pain in the chest that is not relieved by resting changing positions, or medication. Pain may spread to jaw, neck, or arms.
 - 2. Difficulty breathing: Victim may feel short of breath or is breathing faster than normal.
- 3. Abnormal skin appearance: Victim's skin may be pale, ashen (gray) or bluish in color. Victim's skin may also feel cool and moist.
 - 4. Dizziness, light-headedness, or fainting.
 - 5. Nausea and/or vomiting.
 - 6. Not all of these signals occur in every heart attack. If you are with someone having "signals", expect denial.
 - 7. Insist on calling 911

Remember the best thing you can do is stay calm. Remember your ABC's (airway, breathe, circulate) and if you do not or have not taken a CPR class it is good to know and you can call the American Heart Association for the classes nearest to you. I hope some of this helps you to think and also remember what to do and I will work on getting a picture to go next to the AED that helps do the step by step instructions of CPR with pictures. Have a great rest of your month and keep smiling!



Anglers' Corner

Well, WSB season is rapidly approaching, and it is time for me to be my usual pain in the butt on the subject of WSB etiquette We all know (I hope) the Sportfishing regulations; 1 WSB of 28 in. or larger during the main spawning period from March 15 to June 15 (commercial fishermen cannot take WSB during this spawn period). Catch and release is "legal" prior to "take" (kill) of the 1 WSB limit. No targeting of or catch and release of WSB after the 1 fish limit, but hand off is to another angler is legal under the "boat limit" of one per angler aboard, but once the boat limit is met, NO MORE TARGETING OF WSB. Before and after March 15 to June 15, the legal limit is 3 per angler;

Over the years the inherent physical weakness of this wonderful, recovering fish has been discussed to death, with the final word coming from those who know best: the research staff at Hubs Sea World WSB hatchery, who work with and observe these fish daily: "WSB DO NOT RELEASE WELL – tears in swim bladder if brought up from below 60 ft (40 ft. is probable), and bladder tears will result if they dive to those depths during the fight, even if hooked near surface". Even touching these fish can cause irreparable damage (hatchery folk say their handprint burn is visible on WSB skin just a day or so after handling and these fish eventually die). If you grab them by the jaw bone to extract the hook, it breaks easily. Don't be fooled by the size they attain – they are delicate. And the bigger they are, the less likely they are to survive a release. The fish are spent, bloated, and that's what makes them the easiest fish to gaff solo.

I have often heard anglers describe WSB as a fast growing species, and mention them in the company of bluefin tuna, yellowtail, and dorado. While it is true that they are RELATIVELY fast growing fish compared to rockfish, halibut or calico bass, their LONGEVITY is much greater than other fast growing fish. Therefore big female breeders are important to the growth, abundance, and survival of the species.
