Message From The Commodore **Larry Golkin**







2009 has been an extraordinary year of change and development at Channel Islands Yacht Club. At the conclusion of last year, the membership voted for a "Minimum" program. Unfortunately, at the start of this year, we did not have the technology or the people to make it work. This was a major undertaking, and it took much of the first half of the year to make it happen. Space and personnel were required. Additionally, our club's accounting mechanism had to evolve, and it had to do so very rapidly, in order to accommodate the Minimum program. In that regard, advancements in technology often require a lot of work at the beginning. Computers do not "think", they only respond, and nowhere is the adage, "garbage in – garbage out", more true than in the world of technology. So, it had to be right, before we could make it happen. This took an enormous effort. Soon enough, however, everything was in place. Accuracy and integrity, as well as efficiency in business/ corporate accounting, the likes of which our club has never seen, were established. Fabulous people have been hired to aid in maintaining the processes. The equipment is in place. Our income has virtually doubled from last year. However, our costs have increased. We are open more hours. and each and every member enjoys unfettered access to the facilities any time they want. We completed the renovation of the club, leaving little for the incoming Rear Commodore to concern herself with beyond maintenance. Our water program has done well, and we went not a single week without fine meals and entertainment. What more could one ask for?

So where does all this leave us? It seems like every time we turn around, our club is asking more of our members; whether it is raising prices in the bar, maintaining higher prices for dinners, or literally demanding that we participate in each and every activity, lest we be accused of not "supporting" our club. We need the income. And throughout all of this, we have tried very hard to make our club a more user friendly place, a kinder and gentler habitat for us all. It is this "for all" that has been and will likely continue to be the most harrowing venture in leadership.

I believe we have entered into a new place; a place we are going to have to figure a way out of. I will refer to it as "evolutionary purgatory" (EP). EP may be defined as a condition in which we as a species are starting to evolve into a new species, but are stuck in between what we once were and what the forces of nature dictate we become. We started out 50 years ago as a self help club. Today, we have technology and processes in place to manage an environment our founding members clearly did not imagine, and a complexity of business operations that are, generally speaking, more than a self-help membership organization can manage without professional help. More importantly, however, the spirit of self-help is caught in limbo. Our club simply does not have the membership with the time, the energy, the will, or the desire to work as hard as our founding members did, or how hard several of our older members continue to do. There are multiple reasons for this including, but not limited to, the economy, the effects of aging, and the notion that life is stressful enough and that the club is for relaxation not work. Either way, the fact is we are no longer a unified self-help club, and we cannot afford to be a full-service club. We still depend on our members to "do", but there is so much more to "do" and not enough folks to "do" it all. Yet, without a membership still willing to "do", the club has no choice but to continue asking more from its membership – taxing its membership, if you will. I abhor taxes and abhor even more the concept of "tax and spend." It is not even about the more efficient use of funds. They have to be used, and we need more of them. Unfortunately, short of growing our membership to larger numbers thereby requiring more in the way of administrative oversight and management, we simply cannot generate more income.

So, I realize I helped to get us here, to this evolutional purgatory, but I think it was actually bound to happen. I just found myself in the middle of it, and made every effort to muddle through. We have a large group of members screaming for massive changes in club policy and character. We have others (actually a much smaller group) demanding that we go back to the way it once was. Then there is me, in the middle, with no vote, hoping the penultimate solution will rear its head amongst the discourse, only to be disappointed that, not even the slightest concept of what to do made itself apparent.

EP is tough, folks. I believe change is always difficult, and especially when it is necessary, because the cost can be extremely high. Not only in dollars, but to the people change effects. From a strictly scientific standpoint, an unfortunate side effect of evolution is the loss of species that are unable to adapt to changes. Our club, however, is not a laboratory where we can simply accept this kind of demise. We are compelled to seek a middle ground where evolution is seemingly ignored or temporarily halted for the sake of the few who do not want things to change. We cannot sacrifice the few for the benefit of the many. This part of leadership is certainly the toughest part. The toughest part is the balance – the competing currents make for turbulent waters to navigate in.

Nevertheless, we are very fortunate that there are still many members who are willing to step up and carry more than their fair share of the weight in helping maintain the original character of our club – the reason we became the foremost club around. Moreover, this year we had a much larger percentage of folks willing to carry a little weight - whatever weight they could carry - given the constraints of their lives in the tougher, harder world we all live in. So, I ask you, as we go into our 50th year as a membership organization, what do you want to be? We cannot be a self-help club without a membership willing to "do", but we cannot afford to be a full service club. Unfortunately, we seem to have moved away from an emphasis on yachting, and more towards an emphasis on social events. Be that as it may, our future depends on all of us making this decision, and in the months to come, you will have that opportunity. Of this, I am certain.

Notwithstanding all of what I have said in this, my last article as Commodore, for me, this has been a really exciting year. It is unfortunate that one only serves one year given that it takes most of it to really learn the job. I have learned much about diplomacy and teamwork, techniques and manifestations of leadership I never gleaned having spent my entire career self-employed, or the master of the vessel. I believe my experience as Commodore has enriched my life and made me a better person. I had the privilege of getting more out of 2009 than just great meals, fulfilling cocktails, a lot of laughs, interesting and exciting social events, waterborne opportunities, and making new friends. I got to be Commodore. I got to lead a priceless group of people dedicated to making this club the best it can be. Not to coin a phrase, but I got to do things not because they were easy, but because they were hard. Regardless of any perceived difficulty, it really was easy because of so many of you helped. I am grateful for the experience and am thankful that it came to pass. I shall never forget it and am lucky to be able to carry it with me for the rest of my life.

Well, enough of this and that, let's talk about next year. Mary Foster is going to pick up where I leave off. She has the talent, the experience, and the personality to be our leader in our 50th year. She is funny and tough. She has a remarkable sense of humor and rarely takes anything personally. Yet she is also so gentle and kind. I have seen her give so much of herself to friends in need. Generous to the core, Mary Foster will certainly give the club more of herself that I ever could. So listen up: Understand Mary and love her. Like most of our Past Commodores, she is not doing this for herself. She is doing this for you. She will need your help. She deserves your utmost respect. She is a woman of dignity and honor. Mary will make an exceptional Commodore.

So, in conclusion, although the typical metaphysical anecdotal analogy escapes me as I write this last missive, please allow me to thank you all for the great times and the opportunity to serve. It was fun. I'll see you.....on the water.

So far no one has turned in a fish for the November Big Fish of the Month.










































As I Remember----Happy 50thAimiversary




