

Serendipity Strikes Again

It is common in medical science and practice to search for a solution to a problem and come up with totally unexpected discoveries which radically change the practice of medicine and have enormous benefits to society at large. This is serendipity: an unexpected chance finding.

One good example is the discovery of antibiotics. Alexander Fleming (whom I met when I was a teenager) found that bacterial colonies were destroyed after a few spores of penicillin mold accidentally landed and contaminated a Petri dish. But that chance landing, by a few invisible-to-the-naked-eye spores, led to the development of antibiotics and saved millions of lives.

Some seven decades after this happened, the bugs got smarter and started to develop resistance to antibiotics. Actually, they didn't get smarter. But if just one bug (among billions that were offed) survived, because it had a genetic predisposition to outlive the antibiotic attack, then it would replicate and produce resistant offspring. Billions of them.

And, curiously, the more antibiotics are used, the greater the chances of developing resistance. When a farmer uses antibiotics in feed for his animal stock

(which is 80% of all antibiotics used), and when a doctor prescribes antibiotics for a viral infection, they are promoting and aiding resistance.

Simple infections easily treatable in the past could become killers. Think of strep throat, simple cuts, syphilis, tuberculosis, urinary tract infections, pneumonia, MRSA, meningitis, boils, post-operative infections, and a whole host of other infectious diseases. All of these could become serious killers, causing millions upon millions to perish.

Luckily, serendipity strikes again. In Great Britain scientists were trying to develop new anti-cancer drugs that would attack mitochondria within the cancer cells. Mitochondria are like tiny energy factories within the cells. Without them a cell can't survive or reproduce. And they had some success. Then somebody thought, 'What if we try using these simple chemical compounds to destroy bacteria?'

And it worked! Some 800 chemicals were developed and ten were chosen for testing. Those were as effective against bacteria as the most powerful antibiotics of the past. This is really a groundbreaking discovery which will serve us all well.

City of Oxnard Declines County's Settlement Proposal for the Fisherman's Wharf Development

AND

Channel Islands Beach Community Services District (CIBCSD) Declares its Opposition to the Project and Supports the City's Review Process

On July 6th, Ventura County and the Harbor Department representatives met with City representatives and submitted a Settlement Offer regarding the proposed Fisherman's Wharf project. The County's settlement terms appeared to offer no benefit of substance to the City other than "the County would agree to withdraw the Dispute Resolution currently scheduled for Coastal Commission hearing in August and agree to remove any threat of litigation, including by the County and the developer".

In a July 12th letter responding to the County, the City declined the settlement offer and sent a counter offer to the County. The City's counter offer proposed that the County and/or developer make a formal submittal of a Specific Plan that would include a California Environmental Quality Act analysis. In turn the City would commit to timely processing of such and "an open and public process that encourages feedback from stakeholders, including the County, the proposed developer and nearby residents". The City also reasserted its jurisdictional authority under its Local Coastal Plan.

On July 14th, the Channel Islands Beach Community Service District (CIBCSD) sent a letter to the Coastal Commission declaring its opposition to the Public Works Plan Amendment 7, the Fisherman's Wharf project. The CIBCSD is a government agency organized under California Government Code 61,000 et Seg. CIBCSD provides water service to the harbor and represents the residents of the unincorporated communities of Hollywood Beach, Hollywood-by-the Sea and Silver Strand Beach. The District listed three basic reasons for its opposition. First, it is "a continuation of the piecemeal parcel-by-parcel development process that circumvents the procedural and planning requirements of developing a comprehensive Public Works Plan". Second, it creates serious traffic issues. Third, "County Harbor Department has refused to submit Amendment #7 to the City of Oxnard to evaluate the proposal, to determine if the City will amend their Local Coastal Plan (LCP)".

Prior to its letter, the CIBCSD Board held a special meeting on June 27th to hear presentations from both the Harbor&Beach Community Alliance, opposing the project, and the Channel Islands Make checks to: Properties LLC, the project developer. Over 200 people attended this meeting.

As of the writing of this article, no response from the County has been made and no Dispute Resolution hearing had been officially scheduled by the County with the Coastal Commission.






