### Currents

San Salvador



Several weeks ago, San Salvador, a replica of a 200-ton galleon, visited our harbor. It was the first ship to explore the Pacific coast of North America. The year was 1542, and Juan Cabrillo led the expedition with three ships. They sailed north of Cedros Island, discovering San Diego Bay, then passed the coast of Long Beach. They discovered Catalina Island, saw Anacapa, and landed on Santa Cruz, Santa Rosa, and San Miguel islands. The expedition then entered Monterey Bay and sailed as far north as the Russian River, which is about 70 miles north of San Francisco, but they missed San Francisco Bay (the bay would be discovered 200 years later).

Cabrillo recorded the names of numerous Chumash Indian villages in the provinces of Xexo (now Santa Barbara County, which he noted was "ruled by an old woman"), and Xuxu (now Ventura County). At the time these provinces were at war with each other.

The expedition leader and discoverer of California, Juan Cabrillo, was injured during a skirmish with Tongva Indians on Catalina Island and died some time after. He was probably buried there, although a possible headstone was discovered on San Miguel. In California, September 28th is officially "Cabrillo Day."



### CIYC Currents – November 2019 - Racing Report

October was still a busy month for racing. The CIYC/CIWSA co-sponsored Lady at the Helm Race was postponed from September 28 due to heavy weather and held on October 5 instead. Contrary to the previous week, the 6 racers saw very little wind, but all managed to complete their assigned courses. *BANDALOOP*, a J-24 owned by Mike Geer (AYC) and helmed by Christina Ballas, took 1<sup>st</sup> place among the spinnaker fleet, followed by *JEDI* (Akira Jones, Gareth Jones, CIYC), *TORTOISE* (Sydney Brea, Carlos Brea, VYC), and *SELAVY* (Michele Ackerman, CIWSA; Bill Schneberg, PCYC). *WILD HORSES*, a Saga 43 owned by Harry Krum and Rosemary Lippert (CIYC), won 1<sup>st</sup> place in the non-spinnaker fleet with Rosemary at the helm. Second place went to Cindy Arosteguy on Bill Brayton's *MAVERICK* (CIYC). Special thanks to Dann Daggett for providing *PELAGIC PELICAN* as the Race Committee boat and scoring, PRO Bill Brayton, and RC Team Tom Warden, and Tracie and Emily West (CIWSA), as well as Rear Commodore, Linda Weisfuss, for a great breakfast buffet for the Skippers' Meeting and post-race awards hot buffet.

Our WAHINES racing team completed their toughest challenge of the year – the 28<sup>th</sup> annual LEMWOD (Linda Elias Memorial Women's One Design) Regatta. We had a practice day, Friday, October 11, and 7 windward/leeward races on October 12 & 13. It's an honor and a thrill to race these unique and legendary Congressional Cup boats especially in an all-women regatta. Catalina Yachts built 11 Catalina 37s in the early '90s for the Con Cup and donated them to Long Beach YC whose foundation (LBSF) maintains them all in equal race-ready condition. All 11 boats competed this year with 10-12 female crew each. Each of our 7 races had 2 laps, about 1 mile each, which means that while racing we did at least 14 spinnaker hoists and douses, as well as countless tacks and gybes! The competition was tough – the winning team was from Cal YC; their skipper had won LEMWOD a few years ago and, with their main trimmer, won the Women's Match Racing Championship earlier this year. Second place went to another women's match racing champion skipper, representing WSA Santa Monica Bay. Other YC teams from San Francisco, Newport, and San Diego, as well as WSAs and LBSF also competed. Although we came out last overall, we weren't last in every race, we had several good starts, we were in the mix (fouled by the 2<sup>nd</sup> place boat & we fouled another), and we successfully completed a windward douse, which we hadn't done before. We had a great weekend! I've participated in LEMWOD since 2011 and skippered a team of (mostly) Ventura County women for 5 years. We thrive on the camaraderie as we work together to get better and faster. This year's team - mostly WAI'LANI regulars - really coalesced at LEMWOD, and I'm hoping this will carry on into and through 2020!

VYC's Lady Driver race, October 19, saw 2 CIYC boats (*WAI'LANI*, Jane Thomas, & *CHUBASCO*, Angie & Mike Gram) who took 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> places, respectively. Breaking from her traditional all-women crew, *WAI'LANI* sailed with CIYC RAMs Steve Aronson, Jon Lawson, Gareth Jones, and Gene Peck along with *WAI'LANI* regulars, Alison Rowe, Kelly Sherwood-Sloan, Dawnita Fendley, and Skipper Jane. It was another light-air day, and the J-24s (*WITHIN REACH*, VYC, & *BANDALOOP*, AYC) got an early lead and took 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, respectively.

On Sunday, October 20, *WAI'LANI* and *COMPASS ROSE* (Mike & Angie Gram) comprised the CIYC entries in the Care Givers Sailathon Fundraiser, hosted by AYC, PBYC, and VYC. Caregivers is a volunteer organization that helps serve our local elderly population, allowing them to stay in their own homes longer. Sailathon is open to any type of watercraft, and a short lap course is provided for all to follow. Participants solicit pledges for each lap sailed, rowed, paddled, or pedaled. This is a great cause and supports the helping hand we may all need as we grow older in Ventura County. Let's work toward a stronger CIYC presence and support for Care Givers in 2020!

### Anglers' Corner - November 2019 By Frank Sullivan



### **WSB Pens UPDATE:**

Last winter, sea lions got inside our predator nets and caused a major loss of fish, and damage to our predator nets. Hubs Sea World Research Institute staff inspected the nets and determined that before more fish could be delivered the nets must be replaced. The predator net is beyond its usable life and repairs are not sustainable. The cost to replace the net is \$2,200 plus tax and shipping. The containment nets are also at the end of their useful life, and we need to replace them at a cost of approximately \$600 each for 2 nets (\$1,200).

HSWRI is also requiring us to cover over the center pen opening of the 3 pens and leave it unused to promote water flow to the nets on either side of the center pen. We will need approximately \$600 for materials; the labor will be donated as always.

We are trying to raise funds of \$4,000 to cover the costs of the nets and materials to get us back into operation. Some of the funds will come from current Anglers' Club accounts but donations would be appreciated, and we will be looking at fundraising efforts.

We have already raised over \$3,200 and I have ordered the nets. They should be delivered early this month. Then the real work begins: We will have to move the pen floating facility to the shallows by the old launch ramp. We'll drop the old predator net and haul it out on the ramp to let it drain so it can be loaded onto a flatbed truck or into a dumpster to be hauled away. Then we'll install the new net and put the float back in its slip. When it's back in the slip, we will construct a platform to cover the center pen opening to seal it up as HSWRI requested. There will also be other maintenance chores to do at the same time. So I will be calling for some able-bodied help when the time comes.

### Big Fish of the Month:

No one has turned in a fish for the award this month! You just go catch a fish and turn in the weight and photo proof. If you are an Anglers' Club member, you will get \$50.

### Anglers' Club Big Fish Rules:

- 1. Fish must be caught within 100 miles of Channel Islands Harbor.
- 2. Marlin, Sharks, and Rays are not to be considered as winners.
- 3. Must be caught on rod and reel.
- 4. Fish can be verified by any CIYC member.
- 5. Fisherperson must be a paid CIYC Angler.
- 6. Angler must bring the fish to the boat, can have help gaffing or netting.
- 7. CIYC, PCYC or Channel Islands Sportfishing scales can be used, others if verified.
- 8. Tournament fish do not count except for the Big Fish of the Year.
- 9. An angler can only win the Big Fish of the month \$50 one time per year.

The Big Fish of the YEAR \$100 CAN BE a Tournament fish and doesn't have to be a fish that won Big Fish of the Month.

### **Music and Autism**

This is an excerpt from an email sent by a club member who teaches children with ADHD and autism (reprinted with permission):

Thank you so much for last night's concert. Wesley and Alex are beyond talented and super nice people too. I just wanted to share with you the amazing effect of their music on my students. They were mesmerized!

I have quiet time twice a day for about 5 minutes each time. During the first minute or so, my boys usually bicker a little bit over the bean bag chair and pillows. They give each goo-goo eyes to be silly, and they wiggle around. But today... I played the Alhambra song (it's all on YouTube) and a Mozart, and my students went into complete dreamland. It was so quiet I could hear a pin drop, for a solid 5 minutes. I have never seen ANY kids in such a calm state before. And, it lasted with them for the entire day!!! The work they did in the afternoon was incredible. The Park brothers can cure ADHD and Autism!!! No more Ritalin!!!! I'm going to play them more often. Their recordings are done by Guitar Salon, and they're high quality.

And - I looked into this. I had no idea there is an American Music Therapy Association (AMTA). Its members are health professionals who use music in treatment of disorders such as brain injuries, dementia, asthma, pain, autism, sleeping disorders, and Parkinson's disease.

To become a professional musical therapist, one must have a Bachelor's degree from AMTA- approved colleges or universities, including 1200 hours of clinical training, and they are credentialed and licensed. It is an evidence-based health profession, with a strong foundation in research, and with regular scientific meetings and publications. The degree requires knowledge in psychology, medicine, and music.

### **Update:** Oxnard City Council Hearing for Fisherman's Wharf Local Coastal Plan Amendment Delayed to Thursday, November 7<sup>th</sup>

The County requested a continuance for the Fisherman's Wharf project driven Local Coastal Plan Amendment (LCPA) meeting. At this meeting, the City Council will decide to either approve or deny the County and developer's proposed LCPA. The meeting has been rescheduled for Thursday, November 7<sup>th</sup> at 6pm. All those interested should attend the meeting.

If Oxnard approves the LCPA the City will lose its jurisdictional authority to have any say in this development and trigger unintended consequences for the entire harbor and for Oxnard. The City and the public should fully understand the impact this LCPA will have before agreeing to it. This can happen if the County and developer submit either a Specific Plan for the project or apply for an HCI ordinance amendment prior to an LCPA. The HCI Ordinance governs harbor landside zoning.

Updating of the 33-year old Public Works Plan (PWP) for the entire harbor would be the most appropriate action for the County. Even the Coastal Commission has asked and recommended this be done. It ensures an open and transparent public process. An updated PWP would have the legitimate legal basis to hold the County accountable to implement an official harbor master plan that will also help other government agencies and harbor businesses to better plan and budget their services and operations. The Harbor Department's series of community "visioning" exercises, while taking staff time and public funds for consultants, have no legal basis to ensure their implementation. An updated Public Works Plan is a basic good business management practice for improving and developing the harbor. What County, City or business would operate without updating a 33-year old master plan to guide their long-term operations and the development of a valuable coastal asset like Channel Islands Harbor?

### Update: Casa Sirena Hotel Demolition Delayed Another 6-8 Months

The Harbor Department announced another delay in the demolition of the deteriorated Casa Sirena Hotel. The community supported and the County Board of Supervisors approved this project back in March 2016. It took the County more than 2 years to obtain a Notice of Impending Development (NOID) from the Coastal Commission in July 2018 for this unopposed development. Rock revetment and street parking issues that should have been anticipated earlier again delayed demolition to October 2019. Now in October, another 6-8 month demolition delay is announced. The County is now requiring Brighton Management, the hotel developer, to redesign its approved hotel plan at a cost of more than \$100,000 to be compliant with the County's recent building ordinance changes. As of this writing, there was also no finalized signed lease agreement with the hotel developer. These delays raise serious questions and concerns about the County's sincerity and management of harbor revitalization.



### Update: North Shore at Mandalay Bay and Harbor Water Safety

At a September 24, 2019 meeting, the community was assured that prior to any discharge into the Edison Canal, the water would be sampled and analyzed to ensure it is in compliance with the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board requirements.

Speaking at the meeting was also Sara Vela, Project Manager from the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and the lead agency on site contamination. Ms. Vela said that the area clean up was still in process and that her department is monitoring the situation and the developer has been cooperative in meeting its clean up requirements that ensures the site is safe.

Oxnard's Community Development Director, Jeffrey Lambert, said the construction project has a dewatering permit with the Regional Water Control Board for up to 1 million gallons per day of groundwater to be discharged to the Edison Canal. Melissa Schultz, the developer's consultant confirmed that studies have been done and procedures established to ensure monitoring and treatment of water prior to any discharging. This procedure is intended to reduce concentrations of metals, volatile organic compounds, tertiary butyl alcohol and total petroleum hydrocarbons of any runoff from the North Shore at Mandalay Bay construction project. These discharges are only needed when dewatering is required and the permit will be terminated when the construction is complete. The City later that week finalized its technical review and agreed to the subdivision maps for the 300 residential development.


