Hello, Islanders and CIYC Members!





"WITHOUT MUSIC, LIFE WOULD BE A MISTAKE" – Friedrich Nietzsche

When Thomas Jefferson had problems in finding the proper words while penning the Declaration of Independence, he played the violin for inspiration. As did Albert Einstein while struggling with complex equations. It is astonishing how music affects our minds and bodies.

For instance, Baroque music causes the heart to relax and beat to the rhythm. The mind becomes more able to concentrate. Mozart's music, with its pattern of 60 beats per minute, activates the left and right brain. Activation of both hemispheres of the brain maximizes learning and retention of information; listening to such music helps in studying. The ancient Greeks sang their dramas because that helped them to remember the words more easily. If listening to Mozart before taking an IQ test, one's score improves by 9 points.

King George I of England had memory problems. After reading in the Bible that King Saul had the same problem and overcame it by listening to music, he commissioned Handel to write some special music for him. Handel wrote his *Water Music* for this purpose.

High school students who study music have higher grade point averages; they also develop faster physically. The three best schools in the country place special emphasis on music and arts. It's a shame that music programs are cut first when budgetary problems creep in.

Studies using functional MRI (f-MRI) show enormous activation of both hemispheres while a person listens to music. But when one plays an instrument, f-MRI lights up like a Christmas tree. All neurons are firing up and communicating with each other.

Hens lay more eggs when listening to Strauss's Blue Danube, cows yield more milk while listening to Mozart, and wheat grows more quickly when exposed to music.

Luckily for our members, there are a number of musical events happening in the club: Barbara's Variety Show, the Ventura British Brass Band, Razzberry Jazz Band, Ray Ray and the Posse, the Cocoknots, our own CIYC Band, music at social events, and Line Dancing; they all help our brains to fire up.

Oxnard Planning Staff Recommend Denial of Local Coastal Plan Amendment for Fisherman's Wharf 400-Apartment Project

In their report to the Oxnard Planning Commission, the Oxnard Planning staff recommended a denial of the County and developer's, Channel Islands Harbor Properties LLC, request to amend Oxnard's Local Coastal Plan (LCP) to allow the proposed 400-luxury apartment project at Fisherman's Wharf.

A summary of the key findings of the Oxnard Planning staff is:

- 1) If Oxnard approves the amendment and the Coastal Commission certifies it, Oxnard will lose its jurisdictional authority to review, modify, and approve the project.
- 2) The project conflicts with at least 12 Local Coastal Plan policies.
- 3) There is a serious inadequacy of information, plans, and reliable studies to support many of the County and developer's claims about the project.
- 4) Among the major inconsistencies that concerned the staff were:
 - The project does not place a priority on existing recreational boating-support facilities and visitor-serving uses.
 - The project's parking proposal does not meet Oxnard parking requirements.
 - The project's details do not indicate maintenance and expansion of commercial fishing, sportfishing, and recreational boating facilities.
 - The project interferes with maximum public access and constrains existing recreational opportunities
 - The project reduces an existing park by a third to a half an acre and interferes with park access.
 - It is unclear if the project increases and improves public walkways and bike paths.
 - The amendment would compromise public access and coastal resources that would be detrimental to public interest, health, convenience, and welfare.

There will be a **Planning Commission meeting on August 22, 2019**. The Commissioners will hear from the County and developer as well as the public and decide what they will recommend to the Oxnard City Council. The City Council will make the final decision on whether to approve or deny the proposed Local Coastal Plan Amendment (LCPA).

Without an Oxnard Local Coastal Plan Amendment, it will be difficult for the project to proceed as proposed. It is hoped that the County will then operate an open and transparent Request for Proposal process for alternative project proposals that will provide public amenities and benefits commensurate with the value of public waterfront land.

Whale's Tale – What next?

It appears that Fresca II has removed its shipping containers from the Whale's Tale parking lot. There has been no official report from the Harbor Department about what happened after a series of assurances from the Harbor Director that a contract agreement was imminent and would be ready for County Board approval.

Will the Harbor Department conduct an open and transparent Request for Proposal to attract other restaurants or visitor-serving businesses to the facility or let the property continue to deteriorate? The place has been vacant since December 2015. The Harbor Department's concern for Harbor revitalization will become evident by its quick action or delayed response.

CHANNEL ISLANDS YACHT CLUB

HOUSE RULES

- 1. In the absence of the Commodore, the senior officer present has full charge of the premises, subject to the authority of the Board of Directors.
- 2 Minors are not permitted in the defined Bar area when the Bar is open without parental or responsible adult supervision and may not sit or loiter at the bar. Minors shall not purchase or consume alcoholic beverages on the Club premises.
- 3. Guests may utilize the Club facilities providing:
 - a. They are accompanied by a Club member.
 - b. They are visiting members of another recognized yacht club.
 - c. They are Corinthian crew members of a boat participating in a Club event.
 - d. They must sign the guest register and wear a name tag at all times.
- 4. No individual Guest shall utilize the Club more frequently than four (4) times annually. However, there are no limits of visitations for the family of members or a regular companion of a member.
- 5. MEMBERS MUST CLEAR THEIR TABLES AND IMMEDIATE AREA AFTER USE.



- 6. Each Member is responsible for damage to Club property due to his/her carelessness or negligence.
- 7. Minors shall be in the presence and control of an adult member while on the Club premises and shall maintain reasonable decorum.
- 8. No animals allowed except service dogs. Therapy and Comfort animals have not been defined as service animals.
- 9. Appropriate attire shall be worn while on the Club premises. Additionally, while in the Clubhouse: (a) no swimsuits will be worn without a cover-up (b) men must wear shirts (underwear T-shirts are not acceptable), and (c) bare feet are not permitted.
- 10. The use of the Club for transaction of private business is prohibited.
- 11. Violation of House Rules, boisterous or offensive conduct, shall be grounds for expulsion from premises and to further penalties as provided in the Club Bylaws.
- 12. Members and their guests are not to bring their own alcoholic beverages for consumption onto Club premises, except for wine for which a corkage fee has been paid. Non-Club alcoholic beverages shall not be dispensed on the Club premises.
- 13. The Club and its premises shall not be used for political purposes or petition circulation, except for those issues involving the harbor, boating, or related activities.
- 14. The main door shall be closed while the Bar is in operation.
- 15. Members MUST wear a name badge and Guests MUST wear a name tag in order to be served at the bar.
- 16 If you make a reservation for an event and find you can't attend you must cancel by 12:00PM on the day before the event. If you fail to do so, your account will be charged for the event price.
- 17. The term "Assessments" are defined as any amounts voted on by the general membership, the Board of Directors, and any charges made to a club account including, but not limited to food, beverage, and clothing





The **5**th **Annual Chowderfest festival** benefiting the Channel Islands Maritime Museum was held on **August 4**th at the museum's beautiful Channel Islands Harbor location. 




