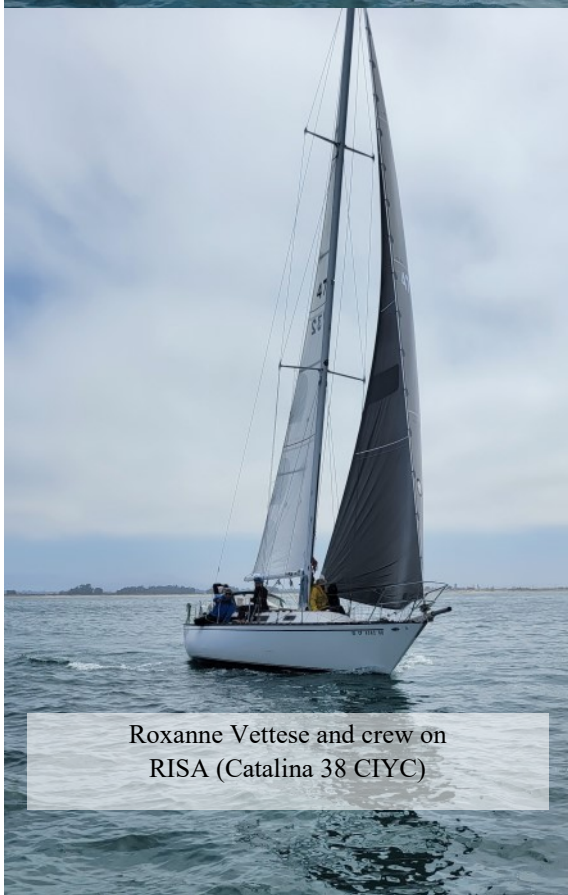

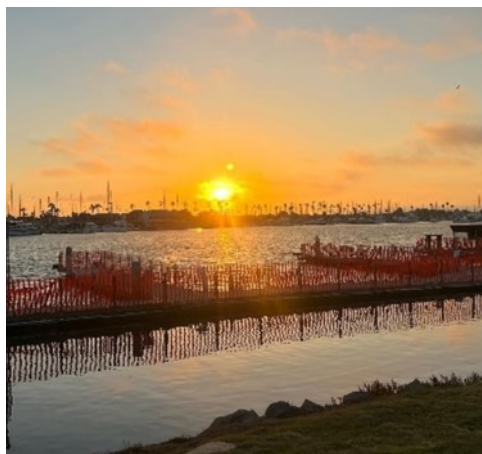


White Sea Bass Grow-out Pen Report:

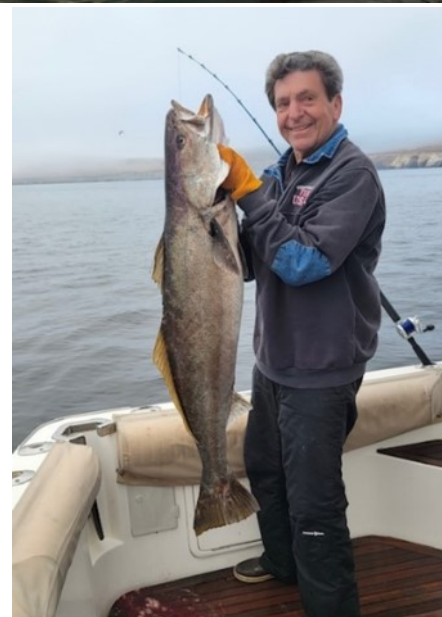
Skip Miser caught this 45-lb. White Seabass at Bechers Bay on Santa Rosa Island on June 22nd.

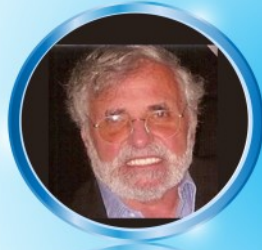

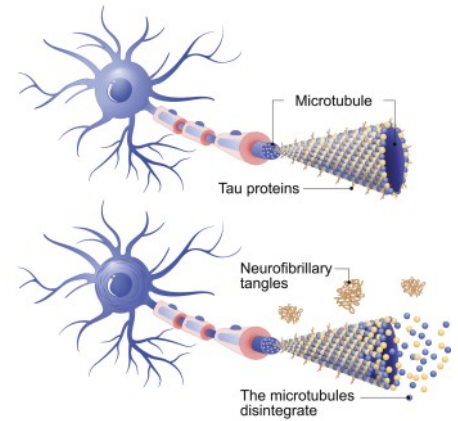
Unfolding dementia proteins

Alzheimer's disease is caused by an abnormal buildup of proteins (amyloid beta) in the brain. When these proteins are misfolded, they end up sticky on the outside and able to clump together to form plaques – which are thought to kill brain cells.

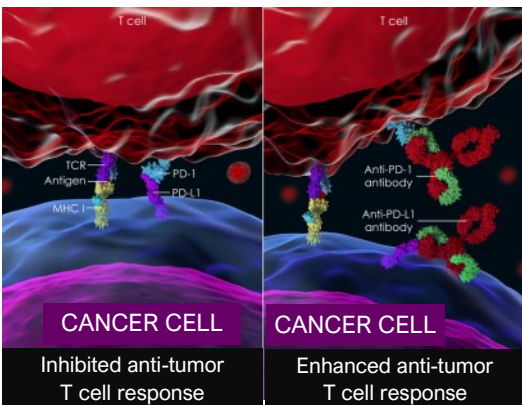
Some scientists thought that using heat to shock these proteins could possibly reverse this misfolding, and they tried to accomplish that by raising patients' body temperatures. They reasoned that this could lead to improvement, citing the fact that Finnish people, who often use saunas, rarely suffer from dementia.

The team from the UK Dementia Research Institute at the University of Cambridge cautioned that the research, partly funded by the Alzheimer's Society, is in its early stages.

Dostarlimab (Jemparli - GalaxoSmithKline)

A group of patients with stage 2 and 3 rectal carcinomas were treated with a monoclonal antibody drug - dostarlimab - and all had remission with no sign of cancer on MRI. It is unprecedented to have such uniformly excellent results. Dostarlimab is specifically designed to block a particular protein (PD-1) involved in cancer cells.

Why is this important?

Almost never in the history of medicine was there 100% remission by treating cancer simply with a drug.

Back pain

The most common cause of back pain is degenerative disk disease. A gelatinous blob (nucleus pulposus) between the vertebrae, surrounded by a fibrous ring (annulus fibrosus), is like a cushion between the two bones. When the gelatinous blob dries out with age or works its way out of the fibrous ring (disk prolapse), the two vertebrae rub against each other - causing pain, instability, and degenerative bone changes.



A group of radiologists from Oklahoma did a preliminary study, whereby they injected a gel (Hydrafil), heated to 149 F, into the emptied disk space. The gel cooled without damaging surrounding tissues, solidified in place, and provided adequate cushioning which was effective in relieving pain. The procedure is quick, easy to accomplish, and was very effective. The study now has to be replicated in larger numbers for the procedure to become widely available.

Although degenerative disk disease is the most common cause of back pain, there are a number of other conditions that have plagued the spine ever since humans started walking upright. Talk to your doctor.

California Coastal Commission Approves Harbor's PWPA 7 Reducing Number of Boat Slips

On June 10th the California Coastal Commission (CCC) approved the Harbor's proposed Public Works Plan Amendment 7 (PWPA 7) with one remediation.

The amendment decreases the minimum number of recreational boat slips from 2,150 to 1,950. The CCC approved one modification as recommended by its staff to the Harbor's proposed change to policy 10. The modification requires "Harbor-wide Slip Size Distribution Standards" as follows:

A minimum of 25% of the total number of slips shall be 32 ft or under in length, and

A minimum of 50% of the total number of slips shall be 38 ft or under in length.

The County is also required to keep an up-to-date harbor-wide accounting of the total number of slips existing and approved through NOIDs (Notice of Impending Development), with a breakdown by slip size. Any NOID for the development or redevelopment of marinas shall include an analysis of harbor-wide conformance with the above standards.

The CCC also noted when marinas are redeveloped in the future, there could be fewer boat slips due to the compliance requirements of the Department of Boating and Waterways and Americans with Disabilities Act standards and regulations calling for wider fingers, docks, and berth sizes.

Though the community did not take a position regarding this PWPA 7, the Harbor & Beach Community Alliance (HBCA) submitted a letter, for the record, outlining concerns for the future of the harbor. Three of those concerns were as follows:

1. This PWPA 7 continues the piecemeal planning of the harbor's development. It again amends only the waterside areas and does not update the landside areas of the harbor. Without an approved harbor master plan for the entire harbor, there is no way to be sure that the harbor will meet its objectives of a "harbor," a water recreational area with lower cost water recreational activities.
2. No physical inventory of the harbor's boat slips has been done since 2008. As admitted by the Harbor Department, boat slip counts have fluctuated, depending upon how the slips are rented and occupied. HBCA has requested an audit be done of the harbor's boat slip inventory by the County Internal Audit Department that has confirmed it will be launching the audit in the coming fiscal year, beginning July 1, 2022. This may also help to clarify how boat slips should be consistently counted.
3. The letter also requested help in better understanding why vacancy rates for harbor slips are high. The letter noted that much of the harbor has been allowed to deteriorate for more than a decade. The slip vacancy rate appeared to have also included unusable slips due to deterioration and weather damage. No data were provided regarding the number of unusable slips clearly evident at the harbor.

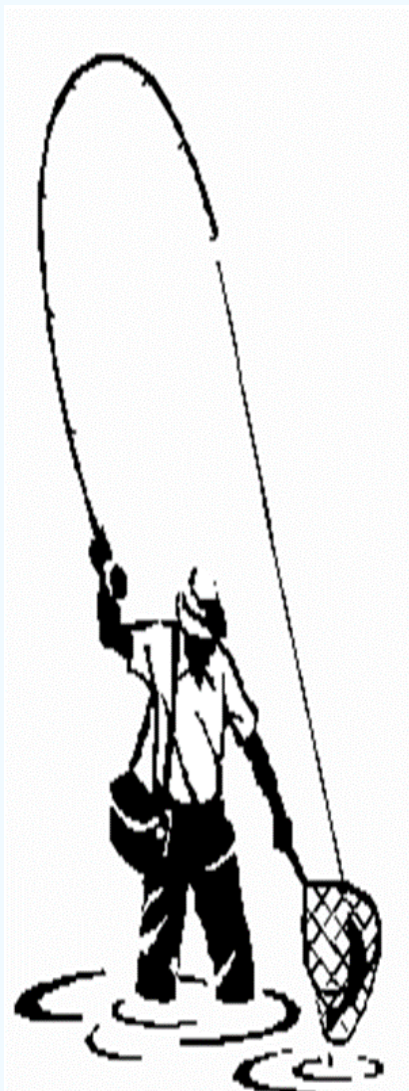

CIYC Racers' Report By Cap'n Jane Thomas



On June 25, CIYC hosted the 9th Annual Wild Bill Rig Race. Bill Brayton originated this race in 2014 as a replacement for the poorly attended Port Royal Regatta. For the perpetual trophy he found a replica of an oil rig with a pivoting crane that lifts and drops by turning a handle. Check it out in the trophy case! With a totally different format – a long course around at least one offshore oil rig vs. multiple short-course, windward-leeward races – the Wild Bill attracts more racers!

Six boats came out for the race – 5 from CIYC and 1 from AYC. For the first time since 2014, Bill raced in this race instead of being the Principal Race Officer (PRO). With Bill and crew transplanted from MADDOG (J24) to BIKINI MACHINE (Olson 30), and owner VYC Vice Commodore, Garrett Baum, aboard, they also took first place! In second was CIYC's VELERO (Islander 29), Brent Swanson. With her full keel she points well, and they had a great weather leg to Platform Gail. Third place went to AYC's CIRRUS (J125), Larry Listing and Bill Wood. Fourth was CIYC's RISA (Catalina 38), Capt. Roxanne Vettese. RISA was recently outfitted with new sails and makes a beautiful profile on the water! Amazingly, over the 16.7nm course, the corrected time difference from fourth to sixth place was less than 2 minutes! Jimmy Jewell skippered his SERENDIPITY (Hunter Legend 40.5) to fifth place, followed by new racer Peter Hopps in his RED SAILS (Lancer 36).

J24 Fleet Report: Thank you to Shaun Plomteaux for getting TINY DANCER's outboard running and making her one step closer to getting on the water! She will be our focus through mid-July with hopes to include her on one of the CIYC 3-boat teams for the Ventura Cup (July 16-17). If you have a few hours to spend, please contact me! She needs some technical skills, e.g., fiberglass, wood fabrication, as well as general cleanup.

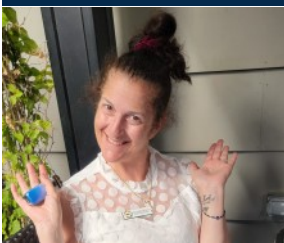
