

Happy Fall to all!!!

I want to start with some quick reminders for our new and old club members alike before I get into the fun stuff!

Yachting Protocol Guidelines, Section 1.7, state that the change from summer to winter yachting attire uniforms takes place on November 1st. Until November 1st, we should still be wearing summer uniforms. This means that we still have one more function, the October 28th General "Bridge" voting meeting, for which we will be wearing white pants, shorts, or skirts with our uniforms. Don't be caught with the wrong pants!

To all our new members, and as a recap for our long-time members, if you make reservations for a dinner or a special event, you must cancel within 24 hours of the event. If you do not cancel with 24 hours' notice, and do not attend the function, you will be charged for your reservation. The 51st CIBFT got off to a slow start with the tropical storm offshore delaying the event by one day. The 18 boats quickly picked up the pace Sunday morning for the remaining 4 days of the tournament. 1st place *Ruckus* caught and released 5 Marlin; 2nd *Skol* caught and released 3 Marlin; 3rd *Legit II* caught and released 2 Marlin; 4th *Bad Habit* caught and released 1 Marlin; and 5th *Dawn Patrol* caught and released 1 Marlin.

Most of the boats in the tournament had incidental catches of Dorado and Bluefin Tuna.

Doc Lines By Fleet Surgeon Zoran Barbaric



Will You Trust Your Doctor in California?

Here's the latest version on California bill: AB-2098.



Section 2270 is added to the Business and Professions Code, to read: "It shall constitute unprofessional conduct for a physician and surgeon to disseminate misinformation or disinformation related to COVID-19, including false or misleading information regarding the nature and risks of the virus, its prevention and treatment; and the development, safety, and effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines."

The Bill effectively forbids and punishes doctors from practicing medicine.

From now on, you will be diagnosed, treated, and followed up by the government. Your doctor will just be a proxy, writing prescriptions according to a protocol established by our trusted CDC, FDA, NIH and such. And those are pencil pushers, funded up to 75% by Pharma (which they also "regulate"), and have never treated a single Covid patient.

Because if your doctor does not recommend what your medically uneducated Senator, Representative, Governor, Director of Public Health, or Medical Board of California deems appropriate, then the doctor will lose his/her/their license to practice medicine.

So even if your doctor is ahead of the CDC and California Public Health system in studying the latest publications, or conducting his own research and is a super expert...NO, he/she/they can't tell you about the newest findings regarding vaccine effectiveness, adverse reactions, death rates, vaccine's effect on your reproductive system, or early treatment and prevention. Yet by the medical code of ethics, they are obligated to do just that. See the conflict? This is exactly what Galileo Galilei and Giordano Bruno were faced with. One spent the rest of his life under house arrest, the other was burned alive.

After Covid, the Bill will be readily applicable to any other disease or condition.

Governor Newsom will have the Bill on his desk by the end of September. Will he sign it?

Miscarriages and menstrual problems following mRNA Covid vaccination.

The UK has just banned the jab for pregnant and lactating pronouns. After two years of saying it was safe. But, hey, what do they know? The US agencies still recommend Covid vaccines before and during pregnancy. Should your doctor inform you about the UK ban? What about his mortgage?

According to an NIH-funded study of 30,000 women, 40% had menstrual changes after vaccination. Projected to US millennial females (16-34 years old), 1,600,000 had post-vaccination menstrual changes. That is a huge number whereby the female reproductive system was affected.

The CDC site clearly states that the mRNA vaccines do not alter the host's DNA. But an in vitro study clearly showed that mRNA enters into liver cells and promptly crosses and enters into the nucleus where it merges with DNA. It is true that this was not demonstrated in living organisms. The problem is it hasn't been proven - or disproven - if it happens in humans. Should Twitter ban the CDC for misinformation?

DailyClout's expert Team 5 research team has <u>reported some alarming numbers</u> from Pfizer's documents: In one vaccinated group of 270 pregnancies, there were "no known outcomes" for 238 of the cases. That leaves us with 36 known outcomes. Of those 36 known outcomes, 28 babies died before or at birth.

The FDA-approved Omicron booster (Wuhan, BA.4/BA.5) was just released, *after testing it on 8 mice*. We don't know how many of the mice were females, but either way, mice do not menstruate. So take this booster bivalent shot at your own peril regarding your reproductive health. Now, will your doctor tell you all this? Or could he/she/ they be afraid of losing his/her/their medical license? By the way, all mice came down with Omicron after the vaccine and were sacrificed too soon to see any long-term effects.

First we were cautioned not to use "horse dewormer." But now we should use a "mouse booster?"

We partner with Del Rey Yacht Club for the Channel Islands to Marina del Rey (CI2MdR) Race, which has become our biggest racing event of the year! This year's race drew a total of 33 boats from Long Beach to Santa Barbara, and many of the racers came to CIYC for drinks, dinner, and/or breakfast prior to the race. The many friendly CIYC volunteers contributed to the event's success at our end, and the racers appreciated our awesome CIYC-style hospitality.

In collaboration with Channel Islands Harbor Marina and Peninsula Yacht Marina we provided overnight reciprocal berths for more than 20 boats. As they arrived Friday afternoon, Mike Geer and I helped most of them land their boats, loaned them a gate/bathroom key, and welcomed them to Channel Islands Harbor and CIYC. Seven boats had berths at the public dock at Peninsula Park or at Peninsula Yacht Marina (PYM) where Cynthia Kerby welcomed them. Unfortunately, it is a 2mi walk from PYM to CIYC.

Not a problem! The *CIYC Taxi Service* (Dodie and Shawn Duffy, Mike Geer, Rick and Deborah Tyhurst, and Sydney and Gary McFarland) came to the sailors' aid and made multiple trips, ferrying the racers to CIYC and back for Friday night dinner and Saturday morning breakfast. Jeff Hancock shared his Beneteau Oceanis 55, LEVEL UP, with the Race Committee: Bill Brayton (PRO), Jane Thomas, Tom Warden, Wailani O'Herlihy, Bonnie Chaney, and Deb Coss (CIWSA). Eric Coyle provided his Parker as the Mark Boat with Kelly Sherwood-Sloan, Gene Peck, and Nick Brouwer as crew. The start line was set approx 0.25nm from the north end of the Channel Islands Harbor detached breakwater, which provided an exciting view from Hollywood Beach as the boats tacked and jibed in preparation for their starts.

The weather gods blessed the fleet with blue skies and winds that were better than anyone expected throughout the day. The racers quickly completed the 3nm beat to Platform Gina, rounded the rig to port, and turned downwind toward Marina del Rey. On the Marine Traffic app we could see several boats sailing at 12+kts as they approached Pt Dume. The PHRF AA boats completed the 44.7nm course in less than 5hrs, and the rest finished in less than 7hrs! Our region, "ASBCYC," was represented by 8 boats, and 4 placed in the top 3 of their class this year:

PHRF AA (6 in Class): 1st place ARGO 4 (Kenny Kieding, SBYC); 1st to finish (elapsed time 04:29:07) and 2nd in class CHRONIC (Lonnie Jarvis, CIYC)

PHRF A (7 in Class): 2nd place UHAMBO (David Chase/Carlos Brea, VYC) and 6th was CIRRUS (Larry Listing, AYC)

PHRF B (7 in Class): 4th place MERLIN (Stephen McMillan, SBSC)

PHRF C (4 in Class): 1st place DJ (Ryan Cox, VYC) , 3rd place VIRTU

(Tom Wilson, PSSA)

Cruising (9 in Class): 9th place SERENDIPITY (Jimmie Jewell, CIYC)

PHRF Overall (33 Total): 1st place DJ (Ryan Cox, VYC)

More than half the boats from last year's race returned this year, and the number of "ASBCYC" boats doubled! Following our pre-race hospitality and the great weather conditions for this year's race, we should expect even more boats next year!

CIYC RACING REPORT continued...

History of the Channel Islands to Marina del Rey Race: CIYC Lifetime Member, Paul Hatcher, won 1st in his class in 1976 during the inaugural distance race from Channel Islands to Santa Monica Bay! Twenty boats sailed a 55nm course from Channel Islands Harbor, taking Anacapa Island to port, and finishing in Redondo Beach. I am unsure of the sequence of events after that, eg, partner clubs closing/merging, change in the course and finish line. My earliest records of this race are from 2013, when we were collaborating with Santa Monica Windjammers Yacht Club (SMWYC). In 2015, the number of entries had withered and the weather forecast worsened, so the race was postponed but never found another date. Thereafter, it dropped off the race calendars for Santa Monica Bay (ASMBYC) and our ASBCYC region until CIYC Staff Commodore Tom Warden talked with Rick Ruskin at Del Rey Yacht Club (DRYC).

Rick and others remember this race from their youth and have been very excited to see it return. We found a date on the 2020 calendar, but COVID cancelled it. We were finally able to hold the race in 2021 and had 37 entries including 4 from our "ASBCYC" region (Santa Barbara, Ventura, Channel Islands, and Westlake). Rick has been a great co-chair and promoter of the revival of this classic distance race!

HARBOR WATCH

Long Delayed Redevelopment of Whale's Tail Gets ERN Approval



At the September 20th Board Meeting, the County awarded a four-month Exclusive Right To Negotiate (ERN) for the Whale's Tail Restaurant to developers Jonathan Zilli and Anthony Carron.

Mr. Zilli is an entrepreneur and restaurant consultant. His partner, Anthony Carron, is an executive chef and owner of the 800 Degree Pizza Chain, Top Round Beef chain and a high-end steak and seafood restaurant: the Coast Range in Solvang.

Over the next four months, the developers will form their ownership entity, begin design and construction analysis, secure funding, and negotiate the terms of an initial phase and long-term lease agreement with the County. The renovation work of the dilapidated building will include improving or replacing plumbing and electrical infrastructure, roof, HVAC system, elevator, kitchen, and also making general aesthetic and ADA-compliant improvements.

The plan is to retain the Whale's Tail name to capture some of the memories of the previous popular restaurant. This is the first stage in the redevelopment process.

Proposals for Fisherman's Wharf Parcels Presented for Public Input

Hundreds participated at the Harbor Department's Public Forum to learn about the proposed plans for developing Fisherman's Wharf. The plan is to consolidate public input and have the developers respond to those comments. It is also important for the public to understand the pros and cons of each proposed plan. Some of the issues and questions raised by these pros and cons are:

- 1. Proposals that include residential will require Public Works Plan (PWP), Local Coastal Plan (LCP), and HCI zoning amendments. These processes, as has been seen, will take 5-7 years. This means Fisherman's Wharf would continue to sit empty and be a deteriorating eyesore and safety liability during this period before any serious construction could start. Therefore, it could be at least a decade before the project was completed and operating. What would happen to the area during this time?
- 2. How does each proposal help differentiate Channel Islands Harbor from other harbors? Will the proposed development be a promotional visitor and tourist driver for the harbor? Will the proposed development offer activities and experiences that are affordable and have wide appeal for those outside the harbor area?
- 3. Given the number of retail shops, bars, and restaurants at the harbor now, both north and south of the bridge, and those coming soon at the new Hyatt Place Hotel and renovated Whale's Tail, how many more restaurants, bars, and shops can this area support, especially when many of the residences are second homes?

These are a few of the issues and questions that the public need to consider in evaluating each proposal. The Harbor & Beach Community Alliance (HBCA) has posted an assessment of pros and cons for each proposal on the website: www.hbca.info.




Cruising Corner—by Dr. Garry G. Kraft



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
