As part of its ongoing 30th anniversary celebrations, Channel Islands Maritime Museum (CIMA) is sponsoring a Search and Find Harbor Cruise

- ♦ Electric boats and dinghy boats less than 25 feet are invited to participate in a fun "Search and Find" Mission. Remember, this is not a race.
- ♦ Plan to enjoy a museum visit, a harbor cruise with a mission, and a chance to win prizes.
- ♦ Winning boats will lay claim to fame and fortune like naval explorers of years past!
- ♦ Pre-entry is required, \$30 donation to CIMA for your boat & crew members.
- ♦ Gather clues for the Search at the Channel Islands Maritime Museum. Packet of clues, charts, and mission to be picked up on day of event.
- ♦ CRUISE AT YOUR LEISURE - start before noon is recommended.
- ♦ Return your documented, sealed discoveries by 1500 hours (3 pm for landlubbers).
- ♦ Each boat entry will have a chance to win prizes. Winner need not be present.

Event Plans

You and your fellow explorers go to the museum to register and obtain instructions and clues for your mission which is to "Search and Find" inside of the harbor. **You must register at CIMA.**

- a. Limited docking is available for a short time at the public dock - OR
- b. Come "by land" and proceed to your boat later - after museum visit.
- c. Use the chart & instructions to navigate the harbor waters in search of the discoveries. Follow the clues and keep a sharp lookout along the route.
- d. Decorate your boat, raise your flag!
- e. Document your discoveries as you go, record addresses, slip numbers, answer questions.
- f. Keep discoveries secret just among your crew members! Other explorers will certainly be nearby, so don't let them claim your discoveries!

Self-Help - Going Through the Chairs The Best Yacht Club in Ventura County! – CIYC! – You!

For most of us, being a member of our self-help yacht club is more than just being involved in boating and having a place to go to have a few drinks at the bar, enjoy a nice dinner, and have a safe drive home. Traditionally, most of our members step up to help out with whatever it takes to enable our club to function and thrive. The rewards are the camaraderie, the feeling of accomplishment, and being trusted to take on a managing position. On the wall at the top of the stairs are photographs of our Commodores, Board Members, and Officers - who have all given their time, effort, and skills.

The Board's responsibilities are to run the Club and make decisions regarding staff, house rules, dues, and more. Board Members serve two-year terms, while each Commodore's position lasts for one year.

We had a Staff Commodore who always asked every member who ran for the Board of Directors if he or she would be willing to "go up the chairs." Following our By-Laws, **the Bridge** (Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore) is selected from the Board of Directors. Going up all three chairs (RC, VC, and C) is very rewarding and educational.

You really learn what it takes to assume responsibility for the position you hold, and you have the satisfaction of having contributed to our club in a very meaningful way.

- ♦ **The Rear Commodore** has the responsibility for everything 'on the water.'
- ♦ **The Vice Commodore** is responsible for the Club House and everything that goes with that.
- ♦ **The Commodore** has the ultimate responsibility for the club.

A good starting point is to read the Flag Officers' Assignments at the beginning of the roster, the House Rules at the back, and to learn all about, and be mindful of, our club's traditions.

It's important for members to read the By-Laws and keep them handy for reference.

Final advice: Come to the club, enjoy all our nice members, clean off your table, and tip our great bartenders. Get involved! Remember: WE ARE A SELF-HELP CLUB! - And that's why we're the best.

Membership:

CIYC offers a variety of memberships that include Regular, Yachting, Racing Associate Member (RAM), and Inactive. This document covers the most common memberships. Dues are charged for each class of membership. The dues are recommended by the Finance Committee, and must be approved by the Board of Directors and General Membership. All interested parties must apply for membership via an application process, and be approved by the current Board of Directors. Dues quoted below are for the year 2021. An application for membership will require a \$100 initiation fee.

The **Regular Membership** is intended for those members who have the right to vote and hold office. The current dues for a Regular Member are \$1000. Dues may be paid one time in January, semiannually, or quarterly. Billing for dues is included in your monthly invoice. Billing for both semiannually and quarterly carries a \$10 per payment charge. The semiannual and quarterly options are a convenience to our members. However, regardless of payment choice, the dues commitment is for the whole year.

The current dues for a **Yachting Membership** are 50% of the Regular Membership. Yachting Memberships are intended for those members under the age of 40. The Yachting Membership does not include the right to vote or hold office.

The current dues for **Racing Associate Member (RAM)** are 20% of the Regular Membership and do not include the right to vote or hold office. RAM Members must register under the CIYC burgee when skipper of a boat in a Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA)-sanctioned regatta or race.

Each RAM must take part in 3 Club events and 6 SCYA-sanctioned events annually. The requirements may change as defined by the Board of Directors.

The current dues for **Inactive Member** are 20% of the Regular Membership and do not include the right to vote or hold office. This is available for a Member who has moved in excess of 100 miles from the Club. The Inactive Member may not reside in the area more than 30 days annually, and may not regularly berth a boat more than 30 days per year within 100 miles of the Club.

Cruising

Cruising is one of the club's 'On the Water' activities. It is important in a couple of ways. It's a great way to get to know other club members who enjoy being on the water, whether anchored at one of our islands or berthed in one of our local harbors. More importantly, we are there for the safety and assistance of our fellow club members. I speak about this as a nine-time Cruise Chair along with my late husband, Tom Naylor.

I cannot begin to count the number of times some important part of a boat broke out at the islands and another member had a spare part that got our member home. Not to mention, diving on the spaghetti we made of our anchor rode or retrieving a pair of reading glasses! We have been pulled back to the harbor by a fellow club member, and we, with our motorsailer, have towed a small power boat back.

I would suggest if you have a boat that can go to the islands, please do so on one of our club cruises. You will learn what a great time you can have on the water, but more importantly, you will learn you are more capable than you think.

Also, a word to the non-boating member of a couple – learn how to operate your boat! You will feel more comfortable at sea if you can take the helm.

RAM Program CIYC

The Racing Associate Membership (RAM) program is all about having sailboat racers join the club and race their boats under the CIYC burgee. The original idea

was that racing sailors use a large part of their income to support their boats (i.e.: sails, taking care of the crew, hardware, upkeep, and so on). The RAMS must compete under the CIYC burgee 6 or 7 races a year, either on their own boat or another CIYC member's boat. RAMS also must volunteer 3 or 4 times at club events throughout the year. Racing Associates shall have all the rights and privileges of Regular Members, including the right to fly the Club burgee and be appointed to committees, but shall not be entitled to vote or hold elective office. A Racing Associate may convert his membership to regular membership at any time. This is a great way to get into racing and to belong to one of the best yacht clubs on the Central Coast!

What is a CIYC Anglers Club member?

For only ten bucks you will have a your name on the Anglers list in the CIYC roster be eligible for the **\$50**

Big Fish of the Month Award, be able to participate in all of the club tournaments, and perhaps win one of the Big Fish of the Year prizes.



Many months sometimes go by when no, or few fish, are weighed in - which means that the ¼ lb. 'mack' may be worth \$50, so weigh him in! An Angler can only win once a year, so we should have 12 different winners.

Anglers Club funds raised during the year have been used for projects around the Yacht Club and for the betterment of our fishing experience and to support the **White Sea Bass Grow-out Pens** in the harbor.

This year we are soliciting ideas from the members on how to improve the services of the Anglers Club.

Club Big Fish Rules:

1. Fish must be caught within 100 miles of Channel Islands Harbor
2. Billfish, Sharks and Rays are not to be considered winners
3. Must be caught on rod and reel
4. Fish can be verified by any CIYC member
5. The angler must be a paid-up CIYC Angler
6. Angler must bring the fish to the boat, but can have help gaffing or netting
7. CIYC, PCYC, or Channel Islands Sportfishing scales can be used, others if verified
8. Tournament fish do not count except for the Big Fish of the Year
9. An angler can only win the Big Fish of the Month once a year

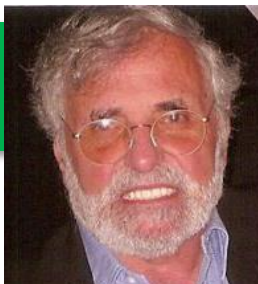

Mushrooms

This meta study of published literature was done by researchers at the Penn State Cancer Institute.

Eating a daily dose of just 18 grams of mushrooms reduces the chance of getting some 17 types of cancer by 45%. (That would be just one or two medium-sized white mushrooms.)

The same result would happen if consuming portobellos, but even more effective are shiitake and oyster mushrooms.

These mushrooms contain **ergothioneine** – a unique antioxidant and anti-inflammatory compound that humans are unable to synthesize on their own. Replenishing antioxidants in the body may help protect against oxidative stress and lower the risk of cancer.

Previously published research from the National University of Singapore found that consumption of shiitake or oyster mushrooms several times a week can improve mild cognitive decline associated with aging. According to the Alzheimer's Society, mild cognitive impairment (MCI) is a condition in which some people have minor problems with their thinking abilities. It is a set of symptoms rather than a specific disease.

These events, in the past have been a blast. If the weather is good, we should have a great time.

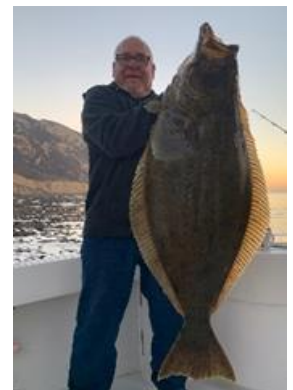

Channel Islands Billfish Tournament

The Channel Islands Billfish Tournament started in 1972 as a spin-off of the Channel Islands Angling Club and was originally known as the Channel Islands Invitational Broadbill Tournament. Only Broadbill Swordfish were targeted in the 1970s, and the largest one ever taken was 454.5 pounds, caught in the first year by Leo "Doc" Hubbert aboard Bud Smith's *Dry Martini*.

Conceived and inspired by Carlos Coello, the tournament was founded by a group of renowned Southern California Anglers: most notably, Ron Tegland Sr., Gerry Garrett, and Roy E ("Ted") Naftziger. Ted is a member of the International Game Fish Association (IGFA) Hall of Fame for, among other things, catching 49 surface-baited Broadbill Swordfish.

In its inaugural 1972 year, 36 boats and 85 anglers reported over 300 sightings with 75 fish baited, 50 hooked up, and 16 landed. These phenomenal numbers have never been repeated. The tournament remained a swordfish-only tournament until the early 1980's when marlin were added to the target species. This expansion was a result of the decline in

numbers of swordfish being caught on the surface. Prior to Eric and Bryce Hermann landing swordfish in the 2019 event aboard Jim Dal Pozzo's *Hydrocarbon*, the last swordfish weighed in the tournament was Eve Radon's 336-pound fish in 1978.

The tournament was officially re-named the Channel Islands Billfish Tournament, and that name lives on today. 2021 marks the Tournament's 50th year, making it the longest running Billfish Tournament in Southern California. It continues to attract top billfishing boats, many of whose anglers count this 5-day tournament as their favorite.

In 2020, even with the pandemic, nearly 20 boats competed. Top honors went to C.G. Miller's *Ruckus* with 5 releases, *Skol* with 4 releases, and *Tight Riv* with 3 releases (all marlin).



This year's Tournament will take place September 11-15.

WSB Grow-out Pen Update:

On May 21st we released almost 10,000 juvenile White Sea Bass from the CIYC-sponsored grow-out facility in the Channel Islands Harbor. This is one of the most successful grow-out seasons we have had, with very few mortalities. Since its inception in 1992, our volunteers have released 254,976 juvenile White Sea Bass from this facility. The Ocean Resources Enhancement Hatchery Program (OREHP) provides the fish for 10 similar volunteer-run facilities along the southern California coast. The OREHP system has released 2.6 million White Sea Bass since 1983 and is now experimenting with raising California Halibut.





Channel Islands Harbor Watch

Harbor Visioning Process Concludes - Final Vision Plan Received and Filed Transparent Development Process To Be Established

The Harbor Department submitted the Final Vision Plan as a "receive and file" document to the County Board of Supervisors on June 22, 2021. The plan was provided for informational purposes only and did not call for any action on the part of the Supervisors.

The plan includes the Power Point presentation from the public workshop that can be seen on the Harbor Department's website, along with comments from Sargent Town Planning and Mark Sandoval, Harbor Director, as well as a list of stakeholders who were interviewed (interesting to note the only developer interviewed was Channel Islands Harbor Properties of the 400- apartment complex at Fisherman's Wharf). Also included are a list of the current regulatory documents and a parcel map of the harbor.

Of immediate importance going forward is the "Potential Future Steps" - specifically, the section on "Near Term Steps (3 Year)." This section outlines the action plan for the next three years and identifies specific actions that the Harbor Department intends to take at the Harbor. Among those important to note are:

- 1) A review of the "Harbor Planning and Development Project Entitlement Process" in the public workshop Power Point presentation to build a detailed standard development process for the Harbor that includes a transparent competitive Request for Proposal (RFP) process, as well as clear public input steps on proposed development. (The Harbor has previously never issued RFPs, only Request for Qualifications. That is a different process with a very different purpose.)
- 2) The County will immediately initiate a proactive development marketing program that includes identification of, and dialogue with, local developers and developers experienced in harbor-front development. They are particularly looking for those that enhance tourism, education, and environmental stewardship of Channel Islands National Park. The priority is to search for and obtain tourism-driven anchor tenants such as the National Park Service, Island Packers, and other

sightseeing services.

- 3) The County will prepare and release RFPs for the six "Opportunity Parcels" identified in the report. The release sequence of the RFPs will start with the smaller, less controversial, parcels first: K-1, Whale's Tail; N-1, Anacapa Boatyard; QRS, Channel Islands Sports Fishing, and F/F1 remnant. Fisherman's Wharf and X3/Y1 parcels will be done after the smaller parcels have proposed projects.

RFPs will include appropriate parameters including land uses, development patterns, connectivity and intensities, building types, sizes, scale and design, public improvements, public priorities, harbor purposes that reflect the desires of the County, City businesses, and communities. These parameters will be employed in ranking and selecting proposals and disclosed in the RFPs.

- 4) County will begin work on the Harbor's Public Works Plan update.

Update on Various Harbor Businesses Impacted by COVID 19

It is anticipated that Waterside Restaurant will obtain the needed business permits that will allow it to open - we hope soon.

At the June 22, 2021, Board of Supervisors meeting, the Harbor Department is requesting a 4th Amendment to the Lease Option Agreement with Brighton Management for the widely supported hotel project on Peninsula Road.

The City of Oxnard is also initiating, as part of the Cooperation Agreement with the County, a street vacation public workshop for the hotel project on June 21st. This will be followed by a Planning Commission review process, and will be subject to a City Council review and approval process, probably in September.

The Harbor Department is also requesting at the June 22nd Board meeting: authorization for the discounting of certain fees and waiving of certain fees, late fees, and penalties for COVID 19-impacted businesses.

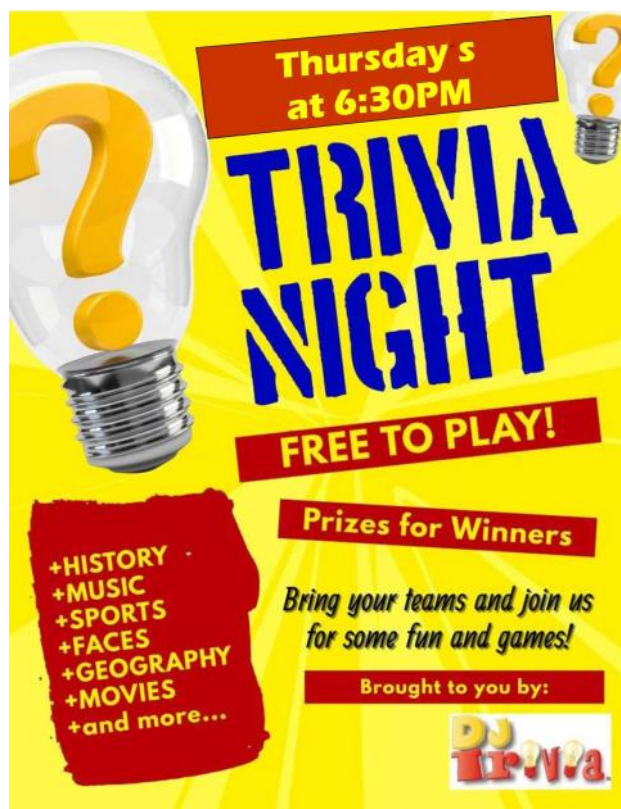

Would you like to have your own e-boat picture on the wall?

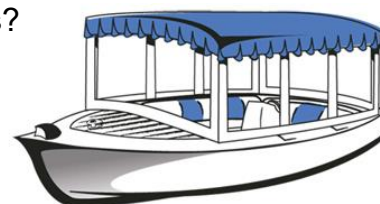
Here's what you need to do:
