Maybe they are just bluffing, but I don't think so; not as they buy me a drink and pay \$7.50 for the same drink I pay \$4.00 for at home using my club card credit on a new system that actually tracks my transactions; nor when I sit down for a marvelous meal prepared by a fellow club member as opposed to some hired chef; nor when I tell them about a dinghy party where close to 70 club members attended; nor when I tell them about our Membership Appreciation Days, nor when I tell them that we have general membership meetings that people actually attend; nor when I tell them that the Board of Directors work well together; nor when I tell them we have champion sailors and run races smoothly according to the rules and that our Race Committee doesn't have to cheat to produce winners for our club; nor when I tell them so many other things about our fine organization, especially the creativity and ingenuity of our members and their profound dedication and devotion to a meaningful, self-help cause.

Channel Islands Yacht Club also happens to have the best view from anywhere in the Channel Islands Harbor; three deck levels to appreciate it from - and a newly decorated interior. But what impresses me most is the people who enjoy it. I have often said that what makes us different from so many other clubs is that, we are not ostentatious and unreal - we are down to earth and unbelievable. Our membership is very diverse and is made up of people from all walks of life; from childhood education to military intervention; from professionals to tradesmen. Our membership has it all. We have folks from so many nationalities and creeds. Our members have such diverse interests that it is no wonder we can exist for 49 years and still come up with creative and innovative ways to entertain ourselves. Yet, with all this diversity, it is inevitable that we will also have differences; differences in taste, in likes and dislikes, ideas, politics, entertainment, wherewithal, and just about everything else that makes us a society. What will make us a superior success, or august, if you will, for the next 50 years, however, is our willingness to understand; to engage in discussion or argument without personal animus; our aspiration to sacrifice our personal views from time to time for the benefit of the whole club. This is not just what makes us a better club. It is what makes us better people.

What truly tears us down, however, is when we lose sight of our integrity and allow selfish self-centeredness to impair our vision of what makes us the premier yacht club on the Central Coast. Many of us have "been there – done that" for many years. And sometimes, many of us close our fine minds to new ideas and to change. I wrote last year at this time that,

"In nature, monotony and homogeneity are the markers of extinction soon coming. The rules of survival and evolution dictate that we must diversify and adapt at the same time; to flow with the endemic tide, and to swim out of it when the opportunity presents itself. This requires that we adapt to, improvise with, and overcome change. The first thing that has to change, however, is our outlook." (August 2008, Currents)

It is with great pain that I hear stories of club members with different, energetic and new ideas or new ways of doing things getting criticized to the point of tears and quitting. What is worse is when this goes on behind the back in cliques. This harkens of the  $4^{th}$  grade and will ultimately spell disaster. New members have left us, and more will soon follow. In one instance I was told that CIYC is not the friendly place they were told it was. Our club will revert to what it was just a short time ago – a hostile place where it was difficult, if not impossible to breathe. Is that what you want? Is this what you consider "fun"?





We must all try to be more august; let us work together to help our club reach its fullest potential. We must put aside petty differences and engage in real discussion without taking offense at every new idea that comes along. Let us exercise tolerance and communicate with one another on every human level. If we have an issue, we must discuss it face to face with courtesy and civility; out in the open; and knock off the back-stabbing. It's ugly and unbecoming, and beneath the dignity of people who can otherwise afford to be members of a yacht club. CIYC is not an elementary school playground.

When I became your Commodore, my goals were simple – bring financial stability and accountability in a professional and businesslike manner; engage the membership in ways that are fun and exciting by encouraging and supporting anyone with a great idea without micromanagement; to inspire folks to live and enjoy life at CIYC, our home away from home, in a free and easygoing way; and to make CIYC a place where folks could come to breathe. I believe we have achieved all of these goals, but the last one seems to be slipping a little.

CIYC is "our" house, not "your" house. All of us are "members" (yes, even those who serve on the Bridge and Board), and all of us deserve the decency and respect afforded all our members, not only in our By Laws and House Rules, but in life. If you don't like something, there is a mechanism to change it – it's called elections. Step up to the plate and run for office, or volunteer <u>your</u> time to help, if you think you can do better. Stay home with your bad attitude, and come back when you are ready to have fun. A bad attitude is like smog – it poisons the air and makes it difficult for everyone to breathe.

If you have been following it, then you know that El Jeffe del Bocce Ball, Paul Hatcher has, in his own inimical fashion, turned our Bocce Ball activity into much more than an afternoon on the lawn. We are taking signups NOW for the 7/18 BS&S course. This is a 3 day course including a full day on navigation and knots. It includes 11 chapters which includes basic boating safety (7 chapters) usually taught plus: navigation, powering your boat, lines & knots, and your boats radio (communications). Time is short so contact Richard Heller @ rgheller@ojaiexpress.net, 805-640-1268 for more information or to sign up.

We are also taking signups for the GPS class on 8/1. This course requires a handheld GPS unit with map/chart capability. This is a hands-on course where you will learn both the theory and practical use of your GPS. By the end of class you will have programmed several waypoints, configured them into a route, set up your trip computer, enabled Trace, and walked the route. If your interest is sailing, the **Sailing Skills & Seamanship class** starts on 8/29. This 3 day class covers the basics of boating safety, the handling of a sailboat, and an overview of navigation and line handling (knots). ## As I Remember----Competitive Sailing

Historian

CIYC competitive sailing has distinguished itself over many years and has been directed by several knowledgeable and dedicated CIYC members, and continues to be very active and successful in 2009, with a group of great members showing how competitive sailing is accomplished.

The early 1980's seemed to set the pace for years to come by identifying and organizing the various components required in setting up a successful Competitive Sailing Racing program. There is far more effort required to facilitate a racing program than that effort that is actually accomplished during sailing events on the water. A Race Committee has to be organized in order to provide planning, training, publicity, mailing, e-mail, phone, as well as being friendly hosts for visiting sailors; these are only some of the efforts involved in conducting a successful racing program.

Prior to becoming Commodore in 1985, Past Commodore Chris McPherson was very instrumental in defining the early 1980s efforts required in the establishment of the fundamental steps resulting in a balanced competitive sailing program for CIYC.

Competitive sailboat racing is actually a coordinated effort with sailboats and powerboats combined to support a sailing event. Powerboats support the Racing Committee by serving as the Starting Boat, setting buoys defining course parameters and alternate turning points as may be required during a race. Specific races may require buoys to be re located or additional added during a race, as well as other support as needed. CIYC has always cooperated with many other local Yacht Clubs as AYC, BPYC, PCYC, VYC, and other Yacht Clubs. Competition in these efforts speaks well for CIYC and sailing actives in general.

Note-- Chris McPherson was in the clubhouse preparing for a race for the following day when a young couple knocked on the door and told Chris, "We just sailed in from Japan and would like to exchange Burgees with your Yacht Club". For the following days race these folks were invited to crew on Andy Nutters OBSESSION, I believe this boat finished in first place. I think the visiting sailors were impressed with CIYC's hospitality.

Competitive sailing is a well organized event and should be supported and enjoyed by as many CIYC members as possible, as it's a lot of fun.

Of course, the calendar is preliminary at this point. And the rules and the protocol are still being formulated. At this point, I plan to run a singles and a doubles League (the American and the UN American) during the season. Within the Doubles league, I planned to have multiple divisions ( a women's division, a men's division, a couples division, a don't ask don't tell division, And perhaps an old timers division (open only to those teams that played during the 2008 Season). For the Doubles League, Standings will be based on scoring, like what was used last year, like what I will tell you about next year. But the point is while no shows will be given the high scores for that night, all teams will be able to throw out three nights of scoring, so everybody has a chance for a bad hair day or a vacation or something.

Meanwhile back at the ranch, time is getting short so I must get down to my briefs. For the preseason, It will mostly be four play. Foreplay, not for profit. This is number one and I am having lots of fun. Do you see why I sea? See you Thursday. JeFe.




