





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## **Doc Lines**

## **Blood Pressure and Other Things**

1) This is an interesting one from the University of Sao Paulo in Brazil. High blood pressure affects about 20% of adults. Some can normalize it by exercising and limiting salt intake and stress. Many elderly people can't exercise if they are overweight or affected by arthritis. A good number need medication to control it. And for some people with high blood pressure, even the pills fail.

In this study doctors recruited those resistant to pills and put them into a swimming pool to do light exercise. Now this has been done before, and it did some good. But in this study, the water was heated to 90F (32C). That's very warm and it did the trick. One hour, three times a week, over a 12- week period reduced blood pressure by an average of 36mmHg/12mmHg. And kept it down even three days later.

The difficulty, of course, is to find a pool heated to that temperature, unless there are lots of little kids swimming, oblivious to pool etiquette. But one can probably find a Jacuzzi, and instead of just soaking, do some light exercise.

There are some rare conditions that can produce high blood pressure and are treatable either by surgery or interventional radiology. Best check with your health care provider (also known as a doctor, a decade or two ago).

- 2) Reducing calorie intake by 10-30% extends life expectancy and slashes the risk of disease. Long ago this was discovered using rats as experimental animals. Now scientists at the University of Wisconsin/Madison showed similar results in rhesus monkeys. This 20-year long study found that a control group of monkeys, allowed to eat as much as they wanted, had 2.9 times the risk of disease and a threefold increased risk of early death, compared to the restricted diet group.
- 3) A doctor was addressing a large audience in Tampa. "The material we put into our stomachs is enough to have killed most of us sitting here, years ago. Red meat is awful. Soft drinks corrode your stomach lining. Chinese food is loaded with MSG. High fat diets, and diets high in hybridized wheat and carbs can be disastrous, and none of us realizes the long-term harm caused by toxins in our drinking water. However, there is one thing that is the most dangerous of all, and most of us have eaten it, or will eat it. Can anyone here tell me what food causes the most grief and suffering for years after eating it?"
