Anglers' Corner - March 2015

Fishing Report:

As I write this in mid-April, there have been reports of just a few White Sea Bass being caught on the Commercial Passenger Fishing Boats. These early reports I hope will be followed by a great season. The daily bag and possession limit for White Sea Bass is three fish, except that only one fish may be taken in waters south of Point Conception between March 15 and June 15. The minimum size limit is 28 inches total length or 20 inches alternate length.

NOAA Synopsis: There is approximately a 70% chance that El Niño will continue through Northern Hemisphere summer 2015, and a greater than 60% chance it will last through autumn. I know that the water temperatures have been warmer this winter than I can remember.

WSB grow-out pen update:

We are schedule to release the almost 8000 fish we grew out over the winter and should be receiving about 30,000 juvenile White Sea Bass to raise through the Summer.

White Sea Bass Recipe:

Marinate:

1/4 cup olive oil, 1/4 cooking wine (white), dash of sea salt, cracked black pepper, some fresh chopped herbs (thyme, basil, chives, parsley) and a sprinkle or two of old bay.

Marinate for about 1 hour then Grill 3-5 minutes on each side. Place on hot grill, wait about 2 minutes and turn the fish. Pour on some reserve marinade. Turn and grill the other side, pour on some reserve marinade. When just cooked through, remove and enjoy.

Squeeze of lemon, make your own tartar sauce and you have a treat. Serve with either rice pilaf or jasmine rice.



Fun Facts of what you should know about Osteoarthritis

Osteoarthritis is the most common form of arthritis, affecting millions of people. It occurs when the protective cartilage on the ends of your bones wears down over time. It is a degenerative disease that worsens over time. Joint pain and stiffness may become severe enough to make daily tasks difficult. When joint pain is this severe, doctors may suggest joint replacement surgery.

Osteoarthritis symptoms often develop slowly and worsen over time. Signs and symptoms of osteoarthritis include pain, tenderness, limited flexibility, grating sensations, and bone spurs.

Osteoarthritis occurs when the cartilage in your joints gradually deteriorates. Cartilage is a tissue that permits nearly frictionless joint motion. In osteoarthritis, the smooth surface of the cartilage becomes rough. Eventually, if the cartilage wears down completely, you may be left with bone rubbing on bone.

There's no known cure for osteoarthritis, but treatments can help reduce pain and maintain joint movement. Osteoarthritis symptoms may be helped by over the counter medications. Acetaminophen "aspirin" such as Tylenol can relieve pain, but it doesn't reduce the

inflammation. Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs such as Advil and Motrin may reduce

inflammation and relieve pain.

Exercising and achieving a healthy weight are the best and most important ways to treat osteoarthritis. Your doctor also may suggest physical therapy and other non-invasive procedures.





K2

No, it's not the second tallest mountain peak, or a canine unit. It's a vitamin. It has been known for a long time that vitamins K1 and K2 are essential factors in the blood-clotting sequence. But more recently, several additional very important functions of K2 have been discovered.

First, K2 activates **osteocalcin**, a dormant blood protein. Once activated, osteocalcin plays an essential role in placing absorbed calcium into the bone matrix. It is essential in maintaining bone strength in menopausal women. So, as vitamin D3 helps calcium enter the blood, osteocalcin tells it where it should properly be deposited. Indeed, in areas of Japan where nutrients are rich in K2, the Japanese have a lower rate of osteoporosis and related bone fractures, compared with the rest of Japan and the Western world.

Second, K2 activates another dormant protein: MGP (matrix gla protein). MGP prevents calcium from depositing in arterial walls, and also in cartilage. In other words, it tells calcium where NOT to go. Some patients with osteoporosis have non-symptomatic, pronounced calcified arterial plaques. This also occurs with adequate calcium supplementation and is known as the "calcium paradox." It has been proven that a lack of K2 can explain both diseases. It was also demonstrated that K2 decreases the rate of calcium deposit, and in some cases reverses the process. Calcified arteries lose much of their elasticity, which leads to high blood pressure and a whole set of cardiovascular problems.

There are several sub-types of K2. The most important is **MK-7**. Once absorbed from the small intestines, MK-7 circulates to the liver, where it's attached to LDL (low-density lipoprotein) and circulates for extended periods of time, activating the two above-mentioned dormant proteins.

The recommended Daily Allowance (RDA) for K vitamins ranges from 80-120 µg. This is enough to satisfy the coagulation factor mechanism, but insufficient to provide the full benefits of K2. K2 is not toxic, but since it plays a part in those on blood thinners, such as Coumadin or Warfarin, those must consult their doctors.

Natural K2 is found in *Bacillus subtilis-fermented* foods, such as the Japanese dish *natto* and fermented cheeses such as Brie. You will not find capsules of K2 (MK-7) in local pharmacies, but K2 (MK-7) can be found online.

If you have osteoporosis or vascular calcification, please read this info twice. Also re-read Doc Lines: July 2013 ("Eat Your Wheaties," NOT), Sept 2013 (WTF!), Sept 2014 (Med Diet).




